





**Comparison of State and Federal Funding for Montana's Workforce System**




**Distribution of Workforce Development Funds by Program Type - 2004**




# Montana's Workforce Development System July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004

To assist disadvantaged micro-entrepreneurs start, expand, or find business.

To broaden participation in the Small Business Innovation Research Program

To stimulate economic development by assisting the private sector to create/retain jobs for low & moderate income persons.

To assist Montana businesses with fewer than 10 employees and gross revenue less than \$500K/year

To provide temporary financial assistance to workers separated from their jobs.

To help businesses find/retain workers and to help job-seekers find work. Migrant & Seasonal Farmworker targets migrant workers.

To provide job search assistance to veterans and assist them with becoming employed.

To assist workers who have lost their jobs due to foreign imports via retraining, relocation, and job search services.





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
