Medical Condition	Possible Medication or treatment
Diabetes	Insulin, insulin pump, blood sugar testing; Glucagon injection
Tuberculosis	Medication, suctioning
Seizures	Medication (oral, suppository); recovery space and time
Cystic Fibrosis	Respiratory interventions
Asthma	Inhaler, ventilator, peak flow meter, epi-pen
Muscular Dystrophy	Wheelchair, medications
Peanut or other food allergy	Epi-pen, inhaler, immediate medical care
Hemophilia	Medication; emergency response
Respiratory Illness	Oxygen, ventilator, lung suctioning
Digestive Disorder	Gastrostomy feeding-tube feeding through stomach wall; Gavage feeding- tube feeding through nose or mouth into the stomach. Either may require dosage and mixture of medication into the feeding mixture.
Shunt for hydrocephalus	Monitoring or maintenance of tube that drains fluid from brain to abdominal cavity
Tracheotomy	Surgical opening in the throat to allow air into the lungs
Catheter	Insertion, removal or cleaning
HIV/AIDS	Medications, universal precautions for blood borne pathogens
