



- Members are appointed by the Governor
- An 18 Member Quasi-Judicial Board created by the Legislature in 1968

Montana Board of Crime Control

The Board is the state's designated agency for criminal and juvenile justice public safety policy, planning and program development

- ✓ develop annual strategic plans that are data driven and performance based
- ✓ provides resources to local, tribal, regional and statewide projects through state and federal grants
- ✓ certifies/decertifies peace officers and other public safety professionals
- ✓ central repository of statewide crime data
- ✓ conduct analysis of crime data
- ✓ publishes the annual "Crime in Montana" report



Peace Officer Standards and Training - POST


- ✓ Sets minimum standards for certifying law enforcement and other public safety officers
- ✓ Investigates Public Safety Officers for revocation/suspension of their certifications
- ✓ Acts to revoke/suspend those certifications.
- ✓ Establishes and approves curriculums and physical fitness requirements
- ✓ Maintains a statewide data base and web site



Peace Officer Standards and Training - POST

Accomplishments:

- ✓ Approved approximately 1,000 training certificates per year
- ✓ Developed and approved 6 public safety officer basic course curriculums in 2004
- ✓ Streamlined and defined the revocation procedure
- ✓ Quarterly Integrity Report



Montana Board of Crime Control Technical Services Unit



The Technical Services Unit:

- ✓ Collects and analyzes crime data from law enforcement
- ✓ Develops and publishes an annual report on crime
- ✓ Maintains agency computer services, databases, and electronic applications
- ✓ Maintains the Board's web site
- ✓ Reports adult and juvenile crime to federal agencies

Montana Board of Crime Control Technical Services Unit



Accomplishments:

- ✓ 90 % of local law enforcement have computerized record management systems
- ✓ 90 % voluntary law enforcement agency crime reporting compliance with FBI standards
- ✓ Development of a website which make available crime data and other pertinent criminal justice information

Grants Planning Bureau

The Grants Planning Bureau provides performance management for state, tribal and local program development in:

- ✓ Is highly competent in analyzing financial information to assist management with planning the efficient use of resources
- ✓ Delivers technical assistance to sub-recipients on how to manage, account for and report on their grant awards
- ✓ Performs oversight to sub-recipients through report review and on-sight program visits.
- ✓ Assures compliance with State and Federal reporting requirements

- ✓ Designed and implemented an electronic Grant Information Management System that effectively controls costs through economical utilization of personnel, materials and equipment

MBCC Resource Development and Management


- ✓ The Board of Crime Control develops multi-year strategic plans to secure federal grants vital to Montana's public safety.






FY 2005 Block Grants Violence Against Women Act




FY 2005 Block Grants Victims of Crime Act


