## Arts In The Park

Don't miss Arts in the Park held the fourth weekend in July each year in Kalispell's Depot Park. The festival is the largest art and music festival in Northwest Montana. With over 100 fine artists and craftsmen, wonderful foods, and great entertainment, this juried art show is a benefit for the Museum and a favorite for browsing and buying jewelry, photography, paintings, and pottery.

## Carnegie Building Centennial

The Hockaday is housed in a turn of the century Carnegie Library Building that is listed in the National Registry of Historic Places. In 2004, the Museum celebrated the centennial of the Carnegie building and the 35th anniversary of the Museum.

Hugh Hockaday (1892-1968) moved to the Flathead Valley after a successful career as a commercial artist. He passed away during the conversion of the Carnegie library to an art center, which was named in his honor.



David Shaner (1934-2002) is recognized as an artist who had considerable impact on contemporary ceramics. His innovative work influenced new growth in 20<sup>th</sup>-century studio ceramics and his perseverance and hard work saved the Archie Bray Foundation from foreclosure in 1966.

Today, it is an honor for the Hockaday Museum of Art to showcase a retrospective on the life's work and accomplishments of this great artist who meant so much to so many people. This retrospective exhibition will span his career as a potter with work from his years at Alfred University to his last designs of cirques and shields. Works for this exhibition are being loaned from many private local collections as well as from the Holter Museum in Helena and the Shaner Family Collection. A special exhibition supplement is available and special thanks go out to Peter Held,

Curator of Ceramics at the Ceramics Research Center at Arizona State University Art Museum and Whitefish resident, Mike Jenson, a potter and friend of the Shaner family. Look forward to a lecture by Peter Held on Shaner's work in April.

The Hockaday Museum is producing banners that will hang on Main Street to advertise this major exhibition. The cost of the banners is \$175 if purchased before January 20 and \$225 after that date. Purchased banners will be available after the exhibition closes.



