I have paid \$375 of my own money to be here today.

I am a husband of my beautiful wife Nanette and a father of 2 children, Kyle age 13 and Shelby age 12, that attend public school in Florence.

My duties as I understand them as a parent are to raise my children to be great people, to be productive citizens.

It is my understanding, that as a citizen, in good standing, of both the United States of America and the State of Montana, I have a right to choose my religious belief, to practice that belief, and to teach those beliefs to my children.

Senate Bill #199

Section 14. Section 49-3-205, MCA, is amended to read:

49-3-205. Governmental services. (1) All services of every state or local governmental agency must be performed with out discrimination based upon race, color, religion, creed, political ideas, sex, sexual orientation, age, marital status, physical or mental disability, or national origin.

(2) A state or local facility may not be used in the furtherance of any discriminatory practice, ect, ect, ect.

When I was 15 years old, I survived an attempted rape by a 28 year old male homosexual. Even with that said, I currently have befriended all homosexuals I have meet in my life, and I have respected their right to practice their way of life.

This is my Bible, I have a right to believe in what this book teaches and I have a right to teach it to my children. Because my Church would choose to not have a homosexual be a preacher YOU would deny us the right to use my school gymnasium for which I pay taxes.
