11/2004	Snohomish County, Washington	Touch Screen machine changes vote from one candidate to another
11/2004	Cleveland Ohio	Touch Screen machine recorded more votes than registered voters
11/2004	Fairfax County, Virginia	Touch Screen machine changes vote from one candidate to another in addition lay out candidates made it difficult to select some candidate on screen
11/2000	Broward County, Florida	Touch Screen machine changes vote form one candidate to another
11/2000	Broward County, Florida	Touch Screen machine changes vote form one candidate to another
11/2004	Carteret County, North Carolina	Touch Screen machine lost 4,438 votes
11/2004	New Orleans	Thousands of voters were told to come back later because workers couldn't turn on the new voting machines
11/2004	Chelan, King, Kitsap, Klickitat, Pierce, Snohomish and Takima Counties, Washington	Systems were not tested to ensure they properly functioned to federal standards
11/2004	Madison Prish, LA	Touch Screen machine changes vote from one candidate to another
11/2004	Pike County, Ark	Touch Screen machine lost 700 votes
11/2004	Calhoun County, West virgina	Touch Screen lost 229 votes
11/2004	Burke County, NC	Touch Screen lost over 4,000 votes
11/2004	Crittenden County, Arkansas	1853 votes were not fully recorded
11/2004	Worth County, Mo	Touch Screen machine lost 194 votes
11/2004	Adams County, Idaho	Touch Screen machine lost 220 votes
11/2004	Valusia County, Fla	Memory card in machine failed at early voting site and didn't count 13,000 ballots
11/2004	Culpeper County, Va	Touch Screen machines went down due to machines were not resetting because people were voting too fast
11/2004	Westmoreland, VA	All machines went down when poll workers authorizing machines for next voter before the machines had completed routines for the previous one. Eventually 2 machines were working out of 4
11/2004	South FI precincts	Touch Screen machine lost votes
11/2003	Boone County Indiana	Touch Screen machine recorded more votes than registered voters
11/2003	Middlesex City, NY	Touch Screen machine lost votes
11/2003	Lake City, IL	Touch Screen machine lost votes
11/2002	Clay City Kansas	Touch Screen showed a defeat by a slim margin in local race however hand count showed a he won by a landside

**Some important facts**

\*\*\*\* There is no federal agency with regulatory authority or oversight of the US voting machine industry

\*\*\* 30% of all U.S. votes are entered on unverifiable tough screen voting machines, with no paper trail -- that is there is no way to verify that the date coming out of the machine is what was entered by the voters

\*\*\*\*In April 2004, California Secretary of State Kevin Shelley decertified all electronic touch screen voting machines in the state because of "security concerns and lack of voter confidence," He said he was "passing along evidence to the state's attorney general to bring criminal and civil charges against...Diebold..for fraud".
