Chairman Olsen and members of the Committee, my name is Stephenie Ambrose Tubbs and I am here today to support Mr Bob Bergen's resolution to commemorate the Lewis and Clark Bicentennial HJ 24.

I come by my love and respect for Lewis and Clark naturally. My father Stephen Ambrose wrote what many consider to be among the best of the accounts about their Expedition. While he was researching that book he made sure his children experienced as many special places along the trail as we could. That meant canoeing the Missouri River Breaks, hiking the Lolo trail and camping out at Lemhi Pass. He liked to say that the best parts of the trail and of the story of the Expedition occurred in Montana. He would ask Montana audiences "Do you know how lucky you are to live in a state so rich in history and beautiful landscapes?" He admonished youngsters especially to learn as much as they could about the Corps of Discovery, and the people they encountered and the relevance of the Expedition to our state.
