* - the 2003 per diem rate is based on a formula agreed upon by the Department of Corrections. The formula is based on budgeted costs and is similar to what we would want written into the administrative rules under SB477.

** - the 2004 and 2005 per diem rates are calculated using the same formula as 2003, updated for budgeted costs of each fiscal year. This results in a deficit of \$210,043 for fiscal year 2004 and \$340,501 for fiscal year 2005.

*** - ADP (average daily population) is held at the FY2003 budgeted costs. Actual ADP in 2004 and 2005 were less than 138, which would also increase the deficit, but those costs are ignored in this analysis.

**** - The 2003 per diem formula includes depreciation on start-up equipment that DOC did not contribute to during the initial construction.

Due to budget cuts the Governor has ordered, the Department of Corrections will reduce per diem rates effective 7-1-02. The Governor has ordered that we implement reductions now. She has called a Special Session to begin August 5th to address additional shortfalls. Due to this the per diem effective July 1st, 2002 will be reduced by \$2.63/day/inmate.
