- The communications center is up to full staff, keep in mind that over half of the CSO's are brand new and still being trained. There are 3 new shift supervisors to help get things running smoothly. If there are complaints from the field forward them to the admin captain.
- The inventory of all vehicles left roadside after an arrest was discussed. This issue will be brought before the Attorney General's office before proceeding with it.
- We are working on getting the Bond Book's back in production. Sgt. Bosch is currently working on this. These books will be for patrol troops only.
- The current U of M Grizzly security detail was discussed. There is great support for this detail, however some changes need to be made. Capt. Edgell (and Sgt. Butler) has been tasked with contacting the MSU Coach to see if they would like the same assistance. There is also a liability concern with this program. In order for the program to continue we will need to see if funding (donations) can be obtained that would allow the AMHP to contract with officers on an overtime basis so that there would be liability protection in effect.
- The new CAD/RMS system was discussed (presentation by Logisys in the afternoon). Troops are to keep their current Daily Logs in .25 hour increments.
- There will be a minimum standard of 12 alcohol related offense citations (DUI, .02 Driver, .04 CMV, MIP, intoxicated pedestrian, and open container if it passes) per year.
- There has been some concern in the field over the new holsters. Since we have just purchased the current holster it would not be feasible for the patrol to purchase another new holster. The firearms committee will be allowed to recommend two alternate holsters for field use. Troops would be allowed to purchase one of the alternate holsters at their own expense.
- The selection of schedule rotation will be left up to the district commanders. There must be a minimum of a two-week rotation. All schedules will include a 0300 shift on weekends. H.Q. will be kept informed of any changes in scheduling.
- Current policy does not require a troop to carry less than lethal (O.C./ASP) on their duty belt. During the recent "Deadly Encounters" training it became apparent that this could be a problem. This issue will be addressed in a policy change.
- Troops will record (audio and video) all public contacts. Make sure all video equipment is working properly, and replace belt microphone batteries on a regular
