RE: Request of Senator Cromley on SB 403

At the request of Senator Cromley I called Greg Fulton, the Executive Vice President of the Colorado Motor Carriers Association in regards to the cases in Colorado.

Mr. Fulton had stated at two MHTA meetings that there were two such cases in Colorado involving trucking companies and the "Good Samaritan" statute. When I asked him to send me that information he informed me that one case was a Colorado company, but the suit was filed in California. I asked him to send me that case, but I have yet to receive it.

The other alleged case was in Colorado, but has not been filed yet.


He did say that the statute has passed one House in Colorado and was opened up to all employers, not just the trucking industry.

I would say that in light of these circumstances that I apologize for any misinformation that I gave to the committee as I was relying on Mr. Fulton's statements. I have been around this process a long time and know that once your credibility is challenged that you are a less effective advocate for your causes.

I would still say that it would be helpful to clarify that employers cannot be held liable for the actions of employee's when providing "Good Samaritan" service.
