Cost per offender in 9 month Methamphetamine treatment program

273.78 days X \$100/day = \$27,378

Cost per offender in 6 month Pre-Release aftercare program

182.52 days X \$41.47/day/males = \$7,569.10

182.52 days X \$51.44/day/females = \$9,388.83

Total cost per offender in 15 month program

Males \$34,947.10

Females \$36,766.83

Average length of prison sentence for methamphetamine possession, sale or manufacture

41 months

Cost per offender for 15 months in prison facility
