3. It is estimated we will need to provide 500 new certificates in FY 2006. The new certificate will be developed and printed at a cost of \$.15 per form for a cost of \$75 in FY 2006. Mailing the forms to the 56 local registrars will cost \$3.00 for each packet to each registrar for a cost of \$168 in FY2006.
4. Additional new certificates will need to be mailed to each of the 56 local registrars in FY 2007. It is estimated the department will send 350 forms at a cost of \$.15 per form for a cost of \$52.50. Mailing the forms to the 56 local registrars will cost \$3.00 for each packet to each registrar for a cost of \$168.
5. These costs will be absorbed within existing program expenditures.

TECHNICAL NOTES:

Section 1 of the bill states "the certificate must contain the information required under 50-15-221." 50-15-221(3) is the certification that the child was born alive--which is clearly a contradiction in this case. Section 50-15-221 states very little about what has to be on the certificate, other than mentioning how the father's name is to be included (if at all). What goes on a birth certificate is specified in rule instead, as provided by in 50-15-103(3). The Department will need to adopt rules to determine the information required on the Stillborn Certificate, and the criteria for filing.
