Duties. (1) The governor is responsible for the administration of the highway traffic safety 15 program. The governor may contract and do all other things necessary to secure the full benefits available to this 16 state under the Federal Federal Highway Safety Act, of 1966 23 U.S.C. 401 through 403, and, in so doing, may 17 cooperate with federal and state agencies, private and public organizations, and individuals to effectuate the 18 purposes of that enactment and all amendments to it. The governor may appoint an administrator of the highway 19 traffic safety program to carry out the governor's responsibilities under this part. For purposes of participation in the Federal federal Highway Safety Act of 1966, 23 U.S.C. 401 through 403, the governor shall designate the 20 21 superintendent of public instruction as the state agency responsible for all aspects of federally assisted driver 22 education and safety programs in the public schools, including the approval of the programs, certification of 23 teachers, and the acceptance, allocation, and expenditure of funds for driver education in accordance with 24 applicable federal laws and regulations. Nothing in this part interferes with the provisions of Title 20, chapter 7, 25 part 5, or 20-9-603. 26 (2) The department shall: 27 (a) advise and assist the governor in all matters of highway safety and establish comprehensive training 28 programs, including establishment and regulation of driver training schools, certification of the schools and 29 instructors, and establishment of adult training and retraining programs; 30 (b) develop and procure practice driving facilities, simulators, and other teaching aids for school and Legislative - 1 -Authorized Print Version - HB 121

2 (c)(b) establish a continuing and adequate research program designed to determine the causes of accidents and effect a program of prevention—; and

(c) cooperate with the office of public instruction to provide support and maintenance of driver training facilities to THAT comply with the federal Highway Safety Act, 21 23 U.S.C. 401 through 403.

- (3) The department of justice shall:
- 7 (a) establish a uniform system of driver licensing, including mental and physical standards; and
- 8 (b) prescribe and establish safety regulations for motor vehicles and operators."
