5	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT APPLYING THE INFLATION ADJUSTMENT TO THE BASIC AND
6	PER-ANB ENTITLEMENTS, THE QUALITY EDUCATOR PAYMENT, THE INDIAN EDUCATION FOR ALL
7	PAYMENT, AND THE AMERICAN INDIAN ACHIEVEMENT GAP PAYMENT; AMENDING SECTIONS 20-9-306,
8	20-9-327, 20-9-329, AND 20-9-330, MCA; AND PROVIDING EFFECTIVE DATES AND APPLICABILITY DATES."
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10	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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12	Section 1. Section 20-9-306, MCA, is amended to read:
13	"20-9-306. Definitions. As used in this title, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the following
14	definitions apply:
15	(1) "BASE" means base amount for school equity.
16	(2) "BASE aid" means:
17	(a) direct state aid for 44.7% of the basic entitlement and 44.7% of the total per-ANB entitlement for the
18	general fund budget of a district;
19	(b) guaranteed tax base aid for an eligible district for any amount up to 35.3% of the basic entitlement,
20	up to 35.3% of the total per-ANB entitlement budgeted in the general fund budget of a district, and 40% of the
21	special education allowable cost payment;
22	(c) the total quality educator payment;
23	(d) the total at-risk student payment;
24	(e) the total Indian education for all payment; and
25	(f) the total American Indian achievement gap payment.
26	(3) "BASE budget" means the minimum general fund budget of a district, which includes 80% of the basic
27	entitlement, 80% of the total per-ANB entitlement, 100% of the total quality educator payment, 100% of the total
28	at-risk student payment, 100% of the total Indian education for all payment, 100% of the total American Indian
29	achievement gap payment, and 140% of the special education allowable cost payment.
30	(4) "BASE budget levy" means the district levy in support of the BASE budget of a district, which may
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be supplemented by guaranteed tax base aid if the district is eligible under the provisions of 20-9-366 through
 20-9-369.

(5) "BASE funding program" means the state program for the equitable distribution of the state's share
of the cost of Montana's basic system of public elementary schools and high schools, through county equalization
aid as provided in 20-9-331 and 20-9-333 and state equalization aid as provided in 20-9-343, in support of the
BASE budgets of districts and special education allowable cost payments as provided in 20-9-321.

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(6) "Basic entitlement" means:

(a) \$230,199 \$236,552 for each high school district;

9 (b) \$20,718 \$21,290 for each elementary school district or K-12 district elementary program without an
 10 approved and accredited junior high school or middle school; and

(c) the prorated entitlement for each elementary school district or K-12 district elementary program with
 an approved and accredited junior high school or middle school, calculated as follows using either the current
 year ANB or the 3-year ANB provided for in 20-9-311:

(i) \$20,718 \$21,290 times the ratio of the ANB for kindergarten through grade 6 to the total ANB of
 kindergarten through grade 8; plus

(ii) \$230,199 \$236,552 times the ratio of the ANB for grades 7 and 8 to the total ANB of kindergarten
 through grade 8.

(7) "Budget unit" means the unit for which the ANB of a district is calculated separately pursuant to20-9-311.

(8) "Direct state aid" means 44.7% of the basic entitlement and 44.7% of the total per-ANB entitlement
for the general fund budget of a district and funded with state and county equalization aid.

(9) "Maximum general fund budget" means a district's general fund budget amount calculated from the
basic entitlement for the district, the total per-ANB entitlement for the district, the total quality educator payment,
the total at-risk student payment, the total Indian education for all payment, the total American Indian achievement
gap payment, and the greater of:

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(a) 175% of special education allowable cost payments; or

(b) the ratio, expressed as a percentage, of the district's special education allowable cost expenditures
to the district's special education allowable cost payment for the fiscal year that is 2 years previous, with a
maximum allowable ratio of 200%.

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0 (10) "Over-BASE budget levy" means the district levy in support of any general fund amount budgeted

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1 that is above the BASE budget and below the maximum general fund budget for a district.

2 (11) "Total American Indian achievement gap payment" means the payment resulting from multiplying
 3 \$200 \$203 times the number of American Indian students enrolled in the district as provided in 20-9-330.

4 (12) "Total at-risk student payment" means the payment resulting from the distribution of any funds
5 appropriated for the purposes of 20-9-328.

6 (13) "Total Indian education for all payment" means the payment resulting from multiplying \$20.40 \$25
7 times the ANB of the district or \$100 \$125 for each district, whichever is greater, as provided for in 20-9-329.

8 (14) "Total per-ANB entitlement" means the district entitlement resulting from the following calculations
9 and using either the current year ANB or the 3-year ANB provided for in 20-9-311:

(a) for a high school district or a K-12 district high school program, a maximum rate of \$5,704 \$5,861
for the first ANB is decreased at the rate of 50 cents per ANB for each additional ANB of the district up through
800 ANB, with each ANB in excess of 800 receiving the same amount of entitlement as the 800th ANB;

(b) for an elementary school district or a K-12 district elementary program without an approved and
accredited junior high school or middle school, a maximum rate of \$4,456 \$4,579 for the first ANB is decreased
at the rate of 20 cents per ANB for each additional ANB of the district up through 1,000 ANB, with each ANB in
excess of 1,000 receiving the same amount of entitlement as the 1,000th ANB; and

(c) for an elementary school district or a K-12 district elementary program with an approved andaccredited junior high school or middle school, the sum of:

(i) a maximum rate of \$4,456 \$4,579 for the first ANB for kindergarten through grade 6 is decreased at
the rate of 20 cents per ANB for each additional ANB up through 1,000 ANB, with each ANB in excess of 1,000
receiving the same amount of entitlement as the 1,000th ANB; and

(ii) a maximum rate of \$5,704 \$5,861 for the first ANB for grades 7 and 8 is decreased at the rate of 50
 cents per ANB for each additional ANB for grades 7 and 8 up through 800 ANB, with each ANB in excess of 800
 receiving the same amount of entitlement as the 800th ANB.

(15) "Total quality educator payment" means the payment resulting from multiplying \$2,000 \$4,000 times
 the number of full-time equivalent educators as provided in 20-9-327."

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Section 2. Section 20-9-306, MCA, is amended to read:

"20-9-306. Definitions. As used in this title, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the following
 definitions apply:



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1 (1) "BASE" means base amount for school equity. 2 (2) "BASE aid" means: 3 (a) direct state aid for 44.7% of the basic entitlement and 44.7% of the total per-ANB entitlement for the 4 general fund budget of a district; 5 (b) guaranteed tax base aid for an eligible district for any amount up to 35.3% of the basic entitlement, up to 35.3% of the total per-ANB entitlement budgeted in the general fund budget of a district, and 40% of the 6 7 special education allowable cost payment; 8 (c) the total quality educator payment; 9 (d) the total at-risk student payment; 10 (e) the total Indian education for all payment; and 11 (f) the total American Indian achievement gap payment. 12 (3) "BASE budget" means the minimum general fund budget of a district, which includes 80% of the basic 13 entitlement, 80% of the total per-ANB entitlement, 100% of the total quality educator payment, 100% of the total 14 at-risk student payment, 100% of the total Indian education for all payment, 100% of the total American Indian 15 achievement gap payment, and 140% of the special education allowable cost payment. 16 (4) "BASE budget levy" means the district levy in support of the BASE budget of a district, which may 17 be supplemented by guaranteed tax base aid if the district is eligible under the provisions of 20-9-366 through 18 20-9-369. 19 (5) "BASE funding program" means the state program for the equitable distribution of the state's share 20 of the cost of Montana's basic system of public elementary schools and high schools, through county equalization 21 aid as provided in 20-9-331 and 20-9-333 and state equalization aid as provided in 20-9-343, in support of the 22 BASE budgets of districts and special education allowable cost payments as provided in 20-9-321. 23 (6) "Basic entitlement" means: 24 (a) \$230,199 \$243,649 for each high school district; 25 (b) \$20,718 \$21,929 for each elementary school district or K-12 district elementary program without an 26 approved and accredited junior high school or middle school; and 27 (c) the prorated entitlement for each elementary school district or K-12 district elementary program with 28 an approved and accredited junior high school or middle school, calculated as follows using either the current 29 year ANB or the 3-year ANB provided for in 20-9-311: 30 (i) \$20,718 \$21,929 times the ratio of the ANB for kindergarten through grade 6 to the total ANB of Legislative - 4 -Authorized Print Version - HB 152 Services

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1 kindergarten through grade 8; plus

2 (ii) \$230,199 \$243,649 times the ratio of the ANB for grades 7 and 8 to the total ANB of kindergarten
3 through grade 8.

4 (7) "Budget unit" means the unit for which the ANB of a district is calculated separately pursuant to 5 20-9-311.

6 (8) "Direct state aid" means 44.7% of the basic entitlement and 44.7% of the total per-ANB entitlement
7 for the general fund budget of a district and funded with state and county equalization aid.

8 (9) "Maximum general fund budget" means a district's general fund budget amount calculated from the 9 basic entitlement for the district, the total per-ANB entitlement for the district, the total quality educator payment, 10 the total at-risk student payment, the total Indian education for all payment, the total American Indian achievement 11 gap payment, and the greater of:

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(a) 175% of special education allowable cost payments; or

(b) the ratio, expressed as a percentage, of the district's special education allowable cost expenditures
to the district's special education allowable cost payment for the fiscal year that is 2 years previous, with a
maximum allowable ratio of 200%.

16 (10) "Over-BASE budget levy" means the district levy in support of any general fund amount budgeted
17 that is above the BASE budget and below the maximum general fund budget for a district.

(11) "Total American Indian achievement gap payment" means the payment resulting from multiplying
 \$200 \$209 times the number of American Indian students enrolled in the district as provided in 20-9-330.

20 (12) "Total at-risk student payment" means the payment resulting from the distribution of any funds
21 appropriated for the purposes of 20-9-328.

(13) "Total Indian education for all payment" means the payment resulting from multiplying \$20.40 \$26
 times the ANB of the district or \$100 \$130 for each district, whichever is greater, as provided for in 20-9-329.

(14) "Total per-ANB entitlement" means the district entitlement resulting from the following calculations
and using either the current year ANB or the 3-year ANB provided for in 20-9-311:

(a) for a high school district or a K-12 district high school program, a maximum rate of \$5,704 \$6,037
for the first ANB is decreased at the rate of 50 cents per ANB for each additional ANB of the district up through
800 ANB, with each ANB in excess of 800 receiving the same amount of entitlement as the 800th ANB;

(b) for an elementary school district or a K-12 district elementary program without an approved and
 accredited junior high school or middle school, a maximum rate of \$4,456 \$4,716 for the first ANB is decreased

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1	at the rate of 20 cents per ANB for each additional ANB of the district up through 1,000 ANB, with each ANB in
2	excess of 1,000 receiving the same amount of entitlement as the 1,000th ANB; and
3	(c) for an elementary school district or a K-12 district elementary program with an approved and
4	accredited junior high school or middle school, the sum of:
5	(i) a maximum rate of <del>\$4,456</del> <u>\$4,716</u> for the first ANB for kindergarten through grade 6 is decreased at
6	the rate of 20 cents per ANB for each additional ANB up through 1,000 ANB, with each ANB in excess of 1,000
7	receiving the same amount of entitlement as the 1,000th ANB; and
8	(ii) a maximum rate of $\frac{5,704}{6,037}$ for the first ANB for grades 7 and 8 is decreased at the rate of 50
9	cents per ANB for each additional ANB for grades 7 and 8 up through 800 ANB, with each ANB in excess of 800
10	receiving the same amount of entitlement as the 800th ANB.
11	(15) "Total quality educator payment" means the payment resulting from multiplying $\frac{2,000}{4,120}$ times
12	the number of full-time equivalent educators as provided in 20-9-327."
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14	Section 3. Section 20-9-327, MCA, is amended to read:
15	"20-9-327. Quality educator payment. (1) (a) The state shall provide a quality educator payment to:
16	(i) public school districts, as defined in 20-6-101 and 20-6-701;
17	(ii) special education cooperatives, as described in 20-7-451;
18	(iii) the Montana school for the deaf and blind, as described in 20-8-101; and
19	(iv) state youth correctional facilities, as defined in 41-5-103.
20	(b) A special education cooperative that has not met the requirements of 20-7-453 and 20-7-454 may
21	not be funded under the provisions of this section except by approval of the superintendent of public instruction.
22	(2) (a) The quality educator payment for special education cooperatives must be distributed directly to
23	those entities by the superintendent of public instruction.
24	(b) The quality educator payment for the Montana school for the deaf and blind must be distributed to
25	the Montana school for the deaf and blind.
26	(c) The quality educator payment for Pine Hills and Riverside youth correctional facilities must be
27	distributed to those facilities by the department of corrections.
28	(3) The quality educator payment is \$2,000 times calculated as provided in 20-9-306 using the number
29	of full-time equivalent educators, as reported to the superintendent of public instruction for accreditation purposes
30	in the previous school year, each of whom:

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1	(a) holds a valid certificate under the provisions of 20-4-106 and is employed by an entity listed in
2	subsection (1) in a position that requires an educator license in accordance with the administrative rules adopted
3	by the board of public education; or
4	(b) (i) is a licensed professional under 37-8-405, 37-8-415, 37-11-301, 37-15-301, 37-23-201,
5	37-24-301, or 37-25-302; and
6	(ii) is employed by an entity listed in subsection (1) to provide services to students."
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8	Section 4. Section 20-9-329, MCA, is amended to read:
9	"20-9-329. Indian education for all payment. (1) The state shall provide an Indian education for all
10	payment to public school districts, as defined in 20-6-101 and 20-6-701, to implement the provisions of Article
11	X, section 1(2), of the Montana constitution and Title 20, chapter 1, part 5.
12	(2) The Indian education for all payment is the greater of \$100 for each district or \$20.40 for each ANB,
13	calculated as provided in <del>20-9-311, for each fiscal year</del> 20-9-306 and is a component of the BASE budget of the
14	district.
15	(3) The district shall deposit the payment in the general fund of the district."
16	
17	Section 5. Section 20-9-330, MCA, is amended to read:
18	"20-9-330. American Indian achievement gap payment. (1) The state shall provide an American
19	Indian achievement gap payment to public school districts, as defined in 20-6-101 and 20-6-701, for the purpose
20	of closing the educational achievement gap that exists between American Indian students and non-Indian
21	students.
22	(2) (a) The American Indian achievement gap payment is <del>\$200 for each</del> calculated as provided in
23	20-9-306 using the number of American Indian student students enrolled in the district based on the count of
24	regularly enrolled students on the first Monday in October of the prior school year as reported to the office of
25	public instruction.
26	(b) A school district may not require a student to disclose the student's race.
27	(3) The district shall deposit the payment in the general fund of the district.
28	(4) On or before September 15, 2010, the office of public instruction shall report to the governor and the
29	legislature on the change in status of standardized test scores, graduation rates, and drop-out rates of American
30	Indian students using fiscal year 2006 data as a baseline."

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<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 6. Effective dates -- applicability. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2),
[this act] is effective July 1, 2007, and applies to school budgets for school fiscal years beginning on or after July
1, 2007.
(2) [Section 2] is effective July 1, 2008, and applies to school budgets for school fiscal years beginning
on or after July 1, 2008.
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
