4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REQUIRING A GROWTH POLICY TO INCLUDE A STRATEGY FOR
5	PRESERVING PUBLIC ACCESS TO LAKES, STREAMS, RIVERS, AND OTHER WATERWAYS; AND
6	AMENDING SECTION 76-1-601, MCA."
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8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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10	Section 1. Section 76-1-601, MCA, is amended to read:
11	"76-1-601. Growth policy contents. (1) A growth policy may cover all or part of the jurisdictional area.
12	(2) A growth policy must include the elements listed in subsection (3) by October 1, 2006. The extent
13	to which a growth policy addresses the elements of a growth policy that are listed in subsection (3) is at the full
14	discretion of the governing body.
15	(3) A growth policy must include:
16	(a) community goals and objectives;
17	(b) maps and text describing an inventory of the existing characteristics and features of the jurisdictional
18	area, including:
19	(i) land uses;
20	(ii) population;
21	(iii) housing needs;
22	(iv) economic conditions;
23	(v) local services;
24	(vi) public facilities;
25	(vii) natural resources, including all lakes, streams, rivers, and other waterways; and
26	(viii) other characteristics and features proposed by the planning board and adopted by the governing
27	bodies;
28	(c) projected trends for the life of the growth policy for each of the following elements:
29	(i) land use;
30	(ii) population;
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1	(iii) housing needs;
2	(iv) economic conditions;
3	(v) local services;
4	(vi) natural resources, including all lakes, streams, rivers, and other waterways; and
5	(vii) other elements proposed by the planning board and adopted by the governing bodies;
6	(d) a description of policies, regulations, and other measures to be implemented in order to achieve the
7	goals and objectives established pursuant to subsection (3)(a);
8	(e) a strategy for development, maintenance, and replacement of public infrastructure, including drinking
9	water systems, wastewater treatment facilities, sewer systems, solid waste facilities, fire protection facilities,
10	roads, and bridges;
11	(f) an implementation strategy that includes:
12	(i) a timetable for implementing the growth policy;
13	(ii) a list of conditions that will lead to a revision of the growth policy; and
14	(iii) a timetable for reviewing the growth policy at least once every 5 years and revising the policy if
15	necessary;
16	(g) a strategy for preserving public access to lakes, streams, rivers, and other waterways;
17	(g)(h) a statement of how the governing bodies will coordinate and cooperate with other jurisdictions that
18	explains:
19	(i) if a governing body is a city or town, how the governing body will coordinate and cooperate with the
20	county in which the city or town is located on matters related to the growth policy;
21	(ii) if a governing body is a county, how the governing body will coordinate and cooperate with cities and
22	towns located within the county's boundaries on matters related to the growth policy;
23	(h)(i) a statement explaining how the governing bodies will:
24	(i) define the criteria in 76-3-608(3)(a); and
25	(ii) evaluate and make decisions regarding proposed subdivisions with respect to the criteria in
26	76-3-608(3)(a); and
27	(i)(j) a statement explaining how public hearings regarding proposed subdivisions will be conducted.
28	(4) A growth policy may:
29	(a) include one or more neighborhood plans. A neighborhood plan must be consistent with the growth
30	policy.
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1 (b) establish minimum criteria defining the jurisdictional area for a neighborhood plan;

- 2 (c) address the criteria in 76-3-608(3)(a);
- 3 (d) evaluate the effect of subdivision on the criteria in 76-3-608(3)(a);
- 4 (e) describe zoning regulations that will be implemented to address the criteria in 76-3-608(3)(a); and
- 5 (f) identify geographic areas where the governing body intends to authorize an exemption from review
- 6 of the criteria in 76-3-608(3)(a) for proposed subdivisions pursuant to 76-3-608.
- 7 (5) The planning board may propose and the governing bodies may adopt additional elements of a
 8 growth policy in order to fulfill the purpose of this chapter."
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
