4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT GENERALLY REVISING LAWS RELATED TO THE CONTROL OF
5	DISEASES AND INSECTS IN NURSERIES; REVISING DEFINITIONS; DEFINING "PLANT DEALER" AND
6	"LANDSCAPE SERVICE"; REVISING NURSERY LICENSE FEES; CLARIFYING THAT DEPARTMENT
7	ACTIONS REQUIRED TO DEAL WITH INFECTED OR INFESTED NURSERY STOCK MUST BE CONDUCTED
8	AT THE OWNER'S EXPENSE; REVISING THE DEPOSIT AND USE OF NURSERY OR PLANT DEALER FEES
9	AND CIVIL PENALTIES; AND AMENDING SECTIONS 80-7-105, 80-7-106, 80-7-108, 80-7-109, 80-7-110,
10	80-7-122, 80-7-123, 80-7-133, AND 80-7-135, MCA."
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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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14	Section 1. Section 80-7-105, MCA, is amended to read:
15	"80-7-105. Definitions. Unless the context requires otherwise, in this chapter, the following definitions
16	apply:
17	(1) "Firm" means an individual, company, partnership, association, or corporation.
18	(2) "Landscape service" means a firm that buys, sells, or resells nursery stock.
19	(2)(3) "Nursery" means the business or location where nursery stock is grown or offered for sale or
20	resale or as part of a landscape service.
21	(3)(4) "Nursery stock" means botanically classified plants or parts of plants, including but not limited to
22	tropical potted plants, aquatic plants, cut trees and their products, and turf or sod grass. The following plants and
23	plant materials may not be considered nursery stock:
24	(a) aquatic plants used for aquarium purposes;
25	(b) (a) field crop plants and seeds;
26	(c)(b) pasture grasses;
27	(d)(c) cut plants not for propagation;
28	(e) corms, tubers, and bulbs;
29	(f)(d) fruits or vegetables for human or animal consumption;
30	(g)(e) cut trees and products for processing THAT ARE GOING TO BE PROCESSED TO A POINT THAT THEY NO



1	LONGER REPRESENT A PEST RISK; and
2	(h)(f) plant debris for disposal or processing.
3	(4)(5) "Nursery stock certification" means the process by which the nursery stock or other plants have
4	been inspected and found to meet certification standards established by department rule.
5	(6) "Plant dealer" means a firm that buys plants or plant products from a producer for the purpose of
6	offering the plants or plant products for sale or resale or as part of a landscape service.
7	(5)(7) "Plant inspection certificate" means a document issued by the department or the plant pest
8	regulatory agency of another state that declares that the nursery stock, plants, or plant material grown by the firm
9	named on the certificate is apparently free of injurious plant pests.
10	(6)(8) "Plant pest" means an insect, <u>weed,</u> fungus, virus, bacteria, or other organism that can directly
11	or indirectly injure or cause damage in a plant or a product of a plant and that meets the criteria as a pest
12	established by department rule. For purposes of this chapter, noxious weeds, as defined in 7-22-2101(8)(a)(i),
13	or other exotic weeds are defined as plant pests."
14	
15	Section 2. Section 80-7-106, MCA, is amended to read:
16	"80-7-106. License required application and payment of license fee. (1) A firm, nursery, or plant
17	dealer engaging in the business of selling or distributing nursery stock in this state shall obtain a license for each
18	nursery location from the department.
19	(2) The license must be in the name of the firm, nursery, or plant dealer seeking the license and expires
20	on the anniversary date established by rule by the board of review established in 30-16-302. The applicant shall
21	provide information that the department finds necessary to carry out the provisions and purposes of this chapter
22	and in the form determined by rule by the board of review established in 30-16-302.
23	(3) (a) A nursery that earns less than \$1,000 in gross annual sales of nursery stock and that submits an
24	affidavit to that effect to the department is exempt from licensing.
25	(b) A nursery that earns \$1,000 but less than \$3,000 in gross annual sales of nursery stock and that
26	submits an affidavit to that effect to the department shall pay a license fee of \$30.
27	(c) A nursery that earns \$3,000 or more in gross annual sales of nursery stock shall pay a license fee
28	of \$95.
29	(3) The department shall establish license fees by rule. License fees may be no less than \$95 or more
30	than \$125. If the department determines that the revenue from the license fee is inadequate to accomplish the
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1	purposes of this chapter, the department may by rule increase the fee within the statutory limit.
2	(4) A new applicant or a firm, nursery, or plant dealer failing to renew a license on or before the annual
3	anniversary date provided for in subsection (2) shall pay an additional nonrefundable application late fee of \$25
4	for each license.
5	(5) An out-of-state firm that imports nursery stock into Montana for resale by a licensed Montana nursery
6	or plant dealer is not required to obtain a license if the firm is licensed in the state of origin of the nursery stock
7	and if that state extends a similar exemption to Montana firms.
8	(6) If the department determines that the revenue from the license fee is inadequate to accomplish the
9	purposes of this chapter, the department may by rule increase the fee.
10	(7)(6) The fees required by the provisions of this section may be paid by credit card and may be
11	discounted for payment processing charges paid by the department to a third party."
12	
13	Section 3. Section 80-7-108, MCA, is amended to read:
14	"80-7-108. Nursery stock inspection fees. (1) The department may enter <u>the premises of</u> a firm <u>, or</u>
15	nursery, or plant dealer premises during regular business hours for the purpose of inspecting nursery stock or
16	other materials for possible plant pests or for determining licensure compliance. An inspection fee may not be
17	assessed if the department requests the inspection.
18	(2) A firm, or nursery, or plant dealer may request the inspection of nursery stock, plants, or other
19	materials by giving the department 5 days' notice prior to the time when the nursery stock, plants, or other
20	materials are ready for inspection. A firm, or nursery, or plant dealer requesting an inspection shall pay a fee as
21	established by department rule. The fee must cover the actual costs of inspection, surveys, and other services
22	required to issue the plant inspection certificate.
23	(3) The department may issue a plant inspection certificate based on the results of a nursery stock or
24	other plant inspection or inspection survey."
25	
26	Section 4. Section 80-7-109, MCA, is amended to read:
27	"80-7-109. Duty to notify department of infestation. A firm <u>, or</u> nursery <u>, or plant dealer</u> with nursery
28	stock or other materials that are infected or infested with plant pests, as defined in 80-7-105, shall notify the
29	department. The firm, or nursery, or plant dealer shall comply with the instructions of the department for the
30	control of the plant pests."
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2	Section 5. Section 80-7-110, MCA, is amended to read:
3	"80-7-110. Removal of infected nursery stock assessment of costs. (1) If a firm, nursery, or plant
4	dealer that owns owning nursery stock or other materials infected or infested with any injurious plant pest fails
5	to comply with the instructions of the department for the destruction or control of the injurious plant pest or the
6	destruction of the infested or infected nursery stock or other material within the time specified by the department,
7	the department may condemn, remove, or destroy the nursery stock or other material or treat it with a proper
8	remedy at the expense of the owner.
9	(2) If an owner fails to pay the actual cost of the removal, treatment, or destruction within 30 days after
10	notice has been mailed to the owner at the owner's last-known post-office address and to any purchaser of the
11	property under contract for deed at the purchaser's last-known post-office address, the cost becomes a lien on
12	the land of the owner and must be added by the county treasurer to the taxes upon the property and collected
13	as other taxes."
14	
15	Section 6. Section 80-7-122, MCA, is amended to read:
16	"80-7-122. Nursery stock certification. At the request of a licensed firm, or nursery, or plant dealer,
17	the department may inspect nursery stock for the purpose of nursery stock certification. The department shall
18	establish certification standards, inspection procedures, and fees by department rule."
19	
20	Section 7. Section 80-7-123, MCA, is amended to read:
21	"80-7-123. Nursery account investment of funds. (1) There is an account in the state special
22	revenue fund. All inspection and license fee revenue and reimbursements for costs authorized under 80-7-106,
23	80-7-108, <u>80-7-110,</u> 80-7-122, 80-7-135, and this section must be deposited in this account. <u>Revenue in the</u>
24	account must be used for the purposes and provisions of this part.
25	(2) Revenue received under 80-7-106, 80-7-108, 80-7-110, 80-7-122, 80-7-135, and this section not
26	immediately required for the purpose of 80-7-105, 80-7-106, 80-7-108, 80-7-109, <u>80-7-110,</u> 80-7-122, 80-7-135,
27	and this section must be invested in accordance with the unified investment program established in Title 17,
28	chapter 6, part 2. Income from the investments must be deposited in the account."
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30	Section 8. Section 80-7-133, MCA, is amended to read:
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"80-7-133. Acts made unlawful -- penalty. (1) It is unlawful for a firm, nursery, or plant dealer to:
(a) fail to properly identify nursery stock offered for sale at retail. Identification must include but is not
limited to the scientific name, common name, and variety, except with regard to mixed annual plantings. Each
nursery plant offered for sale as a separate plant must be identified. A single means of identification is allowed
on each bundle of bare root seedlings, liners, or hedging grade nursery stock.

6 (b) falsely represent or misrepresent the name, age, variety, or class of any nursery stock sold or offered
7 for sale;

8 (c) falsely represent or state that any nursery stock offered for sale, sold, or delivered was grown in or
 9 came from a certain nursery or locality location, when in fact the nursery stock was grown in or came from
 10 another location or nursery;

(d) deceive or defraud any firm in the sale of any nursery stock by substituting inferior or different
 varieties or ages from those ordered;

(e) willfully or intentionally bring into this state, offer for sale or distribution within this state, or ship, sell,
or deliver upon any sale any nursery stock that is infected or infested with a plant pest dangerous to the
horticultural interests of the state; or <u>that violates any federal or state quarantine; or</u>

(f) sell or distribute nursery stock, or cut decorative <u>plants</u>, or aquarium <u>aquatic</u> plants declared to be
 noxious weeds as defined in 7-22-2101(8)(a)(i).

(2) In case of misrepresentation, false representation, deceit, fraud, substitution, or sale and distribution
of noxious weeds, the firm, nursery, or plant dealer is subject to punishment as provided in 80-7-135 and is liable
to a party damaged or injured; to the extent of all damages sustained, to which may be recovered in a civil action
in any court of competent jurisdiction."

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Section 9. Section 80-7-135, MCA, is amended to read:

"80-7-135. Penalty for violation. (1) A firm, or nursery, or plant dealer that purposely, knowingly, or
 negligently violates or aids in the violation of a provision of this chapter part or of the rules, orders, or quarantines
 of the department adopted under Title 2, chapter 4, and this chapter part commits a civil offense and is subject
 to a civil penalty of not more than \$1,000 for each violation.

(2) Assessment of a civil penalty may be made in conjunction with another warning, order, or
 administrative action authorized by this chapter. A civil penalty collected under this section must be deposited
 in the general fund nursery account established in 80-7-123 for education, training, research, and development

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1 by FOR the nursery industry pursuant to rules established by the department.

- 2 (3) The department shall establish by rule:
- 3 (a) a penalty schedule that establishes the types of penalties and the amounts, not to exceed \$1,000,
- 4 for initial and subsequent offenses; and
- 5 (b) other matters necessary for the administration of civil penalties.
- 6 (4) Sections 80-7-105, 80-7-106, 80-7-108, 80-7-109, 80-7-122, 80-7-123, and this section may not be
- 7 construed as requiring the department or its agents to report violations of this chapter part when the department
- 8 believes that the public interest will be best served by a suitable notice of warning."
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
