4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT CREATING THE WASTE REDUCTION AND RECYCLING GRAN
5	ACT; CREATING A COMMISSION TO ADMINISTER THE ACT; PROVIDING MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS
6	AND A PURPOSE FOR THE COMMISSION; REQUIRING THE COMMISSION TO SET PRIORITIES FOR
7	AWARDING GRANTS; LIMITING COMMISSION EXPENSES; AUTHORIZING A FEE ON SOLID WASTE TO

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10	WHEREAS, demand for waste reduction and recycling is at an alltime high; and
11	WHEREAS, Montana has a goal of increasing the recycling of reusable materials and reducing the
12	amount of waste sent to landfills, but the state's rural character and distance from traditional markets often make
13	it difficult to have both convenient and efficient collection and processing of recyclables in Montana'
14	communities; and
15	WHEREAS, there are high-priority areas of waste management that have not been addressed
16	adequately, including the disposal of electronic waste and some chemicals, that will require a more holisti
17	solution; and
18	WHEREAS, a small fee based on the amount of solid waste generated would not adversely impac
19	Montana's business community, but could create a funding source for matching grants and incentives for the
20	efficient and convenient collection, processing, disposition, and sale of recyclable materials; and
21	WHEREAS, a commission that represents community, state, solid waste, and recycling interests and tha
22	effectively administers funds to encourage waste reduction and recycling will benefit the state greatly.
