7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

9	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Short title. [Sections 1 through 5] may be cited as the "Unattended
10	Children in Motor Vehicles Safety Act".
11	
12	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of [sections 1 through 5] is to protect innocent
13	children from being injured or killed when left alone in a motor vehicle.
14	
15	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Definitions. As used in [sections 1 through 5], unless the context requires
16	otherwise, the following definitions apply:
17	(1) "Motor vehicle" has the meaning provided in 61-1-101.
18	(2) "Unattended child" means a child 8 years of age or younger who is not accompanied by another
19	individual who is at least 14 years of age.
20	
21	NEW SECTION. Section 4. Prohibition on leaving unattended child. A person may not leave an
22	unattended child in a motor vehicle if:
23	(1) the conditions present a risk to the child's health or safety; or
24	(2) the engine of the motor vehicle is running or the keys to the motor vehicle are left in the motor vehicle.
25	
26	NEW SECTION. Section 5. Penalty. (1) A person who violates [section 4] is subject to a civil penalty
27	as follows:
28	(a) for a first violation, a fine of not less than \$200 or more than \$500; and
29	(b) for a second or subsequent violation, a fine of not less than \$500 or more than \$1,000.
30	(2) The fines collected under subsection (1) must be deposited in the general fund of the jurisdiction
