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10	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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12	Section 1. Section 52-3-604, MCA, is amended to read:
13	<b>"52-3-604. Access to long-term care facilities.</b> (1) The <u>SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (2), THE</u> long-term care
14	ombudsman or local ombudsman shall must have access without advance notice to any long-term care facility,
15	including private access to any resident, for the purpose of meeting with residents, investigating and resolving
16	complaints, and advising residents on their rights.
17	(2) Access must be granted to the long-term care ombudsman or local ombudsman during normal
18	visiting hours (9 a.m. to 6 p.m.) and to the long-term care ombudsman DURING NORMAL VISITING HOURS AND TO THE
19	LONG-TERM CARE OMBUDSMAN at any time he considers that either of them considers. A LOCAL OMBUDSMAN MAY
20	HAVE ACCESS AFTER NORMAL VISITING HOURS WITH APPROVAL, DIRECTIONS, AND OVERSIGHT OF THE LONG-TERM CARE
21	OMBUDSMAN WHEN necessary to perform the duties described in 52-3-603.
22	(3) The ombudsman shall carry out the duties described in 52-3-603 in a manner that is least disruptive
23	to resident care and activities."
