12	Section 1. Section 39-71-417, MCA	, is amended to read	d:
13	"39-71-417. Independent contractor certification. (1) (a) A person who regularly and customarily		
14	performs services at a location other than the person's own fixed business location shall apply to the departmen		
15	for an independent contractor exemption certificate unless the person has elected to be bound personally and		
16	individually by the provisions of compensation plan No. 1, 2, or 3.		
17	(b) A person who meets the requir	rements of this sect	tion and receives an independent contractor
18	exemption certificate is not required to obtain a personal workers' compensation insurance policy.		
19	(c) For the purposes of this section, "person" means a sole proprietor, a working member of a		
20	partnership, a working member of a limited liability partnership, or a working member of a member-managed		
21	limited liability company.		
22	(2) The department shall adopt rules	relating to an origina	al application for or renewal of an independent
23	contractor exemption certificate. The department shall adopt by rule the amount of the fee for an application or		
24	certificate renewal. The application or renewal must be accompanied by the fee.		
25	(3) The department shall deposit the a	application or renewa	al fee in an account in the state special revenue
26	fund to pay the costs of administering the program.		
27	(4) (a) Except as provided in subsection (5)(b), to To obtain an independent contractor exemption		
28	certificate, the applicant shall swear to and acknowledge the following:		
29	(i) that the applicant has been and will continue to be free from control or direction over the performance		
30	of the person's own services, both under contract and in fact; and		
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1	(ii) that the applicant is engaged in an independently established trade, occupation, profession, c		
2	business and will provide sufficient documentation of that fact to the department if required.		
3	(b) For the purposes of subsection (4)(a)(i), an endorsement required for licensure, as provided in		
4	37-47-303, does not imply or constitute control.		
5	(5) (a) An applicant for an independent contractor exemption certificate shall submit an application under		
6	oath on a form prescribed by the department and containing the following:		
7	(a)(i) the applicant's name and address;		
8	(b)(ii) the applicant's social security number;		
9	(c)(iii) each occupation for which the applicant is seeking independent contractor certification; and		
10	(d)(iv) except as provided in subsection (5)(b), other documentation as provided by department rule to		
11	assist in determining if the applicant has an independently established business.		
12	(b) An applicant for a renewal of an independent contractor exemption certificate who has been certified		
13	as an independent contractor for a period of at least 10 consecutive years is only required to submit the		
14	application provided for in subsection (5)(a) and the renewal fee.		
15	(6) The department shall issue an independent contractor exemption certificate to an applicant if the		
16	department determines that an applicant meets the requirements of this section.		
17	(7) (a) When the department approves an application for an independent contractor exemption certificate		
18	and the person is working under the independent contractor exemption certificate, the person's status is		
19	conclusively presumed to be that of an independent contractor.		
20	(b) A person working under an approved independent contractor exemption certificate has waived all		
21	rights and benefits under the Workers' Compensation Act and is precluded from obtaining benefits unless the		
22	person has elected to be bound personally and individually by the provisions of compensation plan No. 1, 2, or		
23	3.		
24	(c) For the purposes of the Workers' Compensation Act, a person is working under an independent		
25	contractor exemption certificate if:		
26	(i) the person is performing work in the trade, business, occupation, or profession listed on the person's		
27	independent contractor exemption certificate; and		
28	(ii) the hiring agent and the person holding the independent contractor exemption certificate do not have		
29	a written or an oral agreement that the independent contractor exemption certificate holder's status with respec		
30	to that hiring agent is that of an employee.		
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1 (8) Once issued, an independent contractor exemption certificate remains in effect for 2 years unless:

- 2 (a) suspended or revoked pursuant to 39-71-418; or
- 3 (b) canceled by the independent contractor.
- 4 (9) If the department denies an application for an independent contractor exemption certificate, the

5 applicant may contest the denial by petitioning the workers' compensation court within 30 days of the mailing of

- 6 the denial."
