9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11	Section 1. Section 37-2-104, MCA, is amended to read:
12	"37-2-104. Dispensing of drugs by medical practitioners unlawful exceptions. (1) Except as
13	otherwise provided by this section, it is unlawful for a medical practitioner to engage, directly or indirectly, in the
14	dispensing of drugs.
15	(2) This section does not prohibit:
16	(a) a medical practitioner from furnishing a patient any drug in an emergency;
17	(b) the administration of a unit dose of a drug to a patient by or under the supervision of a medical
18	practitioner;
19	(c) dispensing a drug to a patient by a medical practitioner whenever there is no community pharmacy
20	available to the patient;
21	(d) the dispensing of drugs by a medical practitioner:
22	(i) occasionally, but not as a usual course of doing business, by a medical practitioner; or
23	(ii) at an employer-based onsite clinic pursuant to a written prescription from a medical practitioner;
24	(e) a medical practitioner from dispensing drug samples;
25	(f) the dispensing of factory prepackaged oral contraceptives by a registered nurse employed by a family
26	planning clinic under contract with the department of public health and human services if the dispensing is in
27	accordance with:
28	(i) a physician's written protocol specifying the circumstances under which dispensing is appropriate; and
29	(ii) the drug labeling, storage, and recordkeeping requirements of the board of pharmacy;
30	(g) a contract physician at an urban Indian clinic from dispensing drugs to qualified patients of the clinic.

1 The clinic may not stock or dispense any dangerous drug, as defined in 50-32-101, or any controlled substance.

- 2 The contract physician may not delegate the authority to dispense any drug for which a prescription is required
- 3 under 21 U.S.C. 353(b)."
