

## 1 SENATE BILL NO. 401

2 INTRODUCED BY C. KAUFMANN

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4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT INCREASING THE STANDARD USED TO DETERMINE CASH  
5 ASSISTANCE PAYMENTS FOR THE TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES PROGRAM;  
6 AMENDING SECTIONS 53-4-212 AND 53-4-241, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."

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8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

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10 NEW SECTION. **Section 1. Method of computing monthly benefit payment.** The payment standard  
11 for computing the monthly benefit amount of temporary assistance for needy families cash assistance is set at  
12 40.5% of the annual federal poverty level published by the U.S. department of health and human services. The  
13 department shall use the federal poverty guidelines published after January 1 of each calendar year to establish  
14 the payment level for the fiscal year beginning July 1 of that same calendar year.

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16 **Section 2.** Section 53-4-212, MCA, is amended to read:

17 **"53-4-212. Department to make rules.** (1) The department shall make rules and take action as  
18 necessary or desirable for the administration of public assistance programs.

19 (2) The department shall adopt rules that may include but are not limited to rules concerning:

20 (a) eligibility requirements, including gross and net income limitations, resource limitations, and income  
21 and resource exclusions;

22 (b) amounts of assistance; and methods for computing benefit amounts in compliance with [section 1];  
23 and the length of time for which benefits may be granted;

24 (c) the degree of kinship required for a person to qualify as a specified caretaker relative in order to be  
25 eligible for assistance;

26 (d) procedures and policies for employment and training programs, requirements for participation in  
27 employment and training programs, and exemptions, if any, from participation requirements;

28 (e) requirements for specified caretaker relatives, including cooperation with assessments, the number  
29 of hours of participation required for each month, specific activities required to address employment barriers, and  
30 other terms of performance;

- 1 (f) eligibility for and terms and conditions of child-care assistance for financial assistance recipients,  
2 including maximum amounts of assistance payable and amounts of copayments required by specified caretaker  
3 relatives;
- 4 (g) eligibility criteria and participation requirements for nonfinancial assistance recipients;
- 5 (h) terms of ineligibility or sanctions against a specified caretaker relative or other family member who  
6 fails to enter into a family investment agreement, as provided for in 53-4-606, or to comply with the individual's  
7 obligations under the agreement, including the length of the period of ineligibility, if any;
- 8 (i) requirements, if any, for participation in the employment and training demonstration project;
- 9 (j) eligibility for and terms and conditions of extended medical assistance benefits;
- 10 (k) reporting requirements;
- 11 (l) sanctions, disqualification, or other penalties for failure or refusal to comply with the rules or  
12 requirements of a public assistance program;
- 13 (m) exemptions from the 60-month limitation on assistance provided in 53-4-231 based on hardship or  
14 for families that include an individual who has been battered or subjected to extreme cruelty, as defined in section  
15 103 of the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, 42 U.S.C. 608, including  
16 but not limited to the duration of the exemption;
- 17 (n) individuals who must be included as members of an assistance unit;
- 18 (o) categories of aliens who may receive assistance, if any;
- 19 (p) requirements relating to the assignment of child and medical support rights and cooperation in  
20 establishing paternity and obtaining child and medical support;
- 21 (q) requirements for eligibility and other terms and conditions of other programs to strengthen and  
22 preserve families;
- 23 (r) special eligibility or participation requirements applicable to teenage parents, if any;
- 24 (s) conditions under which assistance may be continued when an adult or a dependent child is  
25 temporarily absent from the home and the length of time for which assistance may be continued;
- 26 (t) any random drug testing or reporting requirements for persons who are required to comply with the  
27 conditions provided under 53-4-231(3) and graduated sanctions that may include terms of ineligibility for violations  
28 of conditions of supervision or treatment requirements. The department may enter into agreements with the  
29 department of corrections regarding testing and reporting on offenders under the supervision of the department  
30 of corrections.

1 (u) approved educational programs, appropriate educational courses of study, employee assessment  
2 instruments, and administration of the Montana parents as scholars program provided for in 53-4-209."

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4 **Section 3.** Section 53-4-241, MCA, is amended to read:

5 **"53-4-241. Amount of assistance determined by department rules.** The amount of financial  
6 assistance or nonfinancial assistance granted in any case must be determined according to [section 1] and the  
7 rules and standards of assistance established by the department."

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9 NEW SECTION. **Section 4. Codification instruction.** [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an  
10 integral part of Title 53, chapter 4, part 2, and the provisions of Title 53, chapter 4, part 2, apply to [section 1].

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12 NEW SECTION. **Section 5. Effective date.** [This act] is effective July 1, 2007.

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
