4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT LIMITING THE USE OF TAX INCREMENT FINANCING TO URBAN
5	RENEWAL; PROVIDING THAT INDUSTRIAL DISTRICTS, TECHNOLOGY DISTRICTS, AND AEROSPACE
6	TRANSPORTATION AND TECHNOLOGY DISTRICTS MAY CONTINUE TO USE TAX INCREMENT
7	FINANCING IF THE DISTRICTS WERE USING TAX INCREMENT FINANCING PRIOR TO THE EFFECTIVE
8	DATE OF THIS ACT; AMENDING SECTIONS 7-15-4282, 7-15-4283, 7-15-4284, 7-15-4288, 7-15-4290,
9	7-15-4295, 7-15-4296, 7-15-4298, 7-15-4299, AND 7-15-4301, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE
10	EFFECTIVE DATE."
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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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14	Section 1. Section 7-15-4282, MCA, is amended to read:
15	<b>"7-15-4282. Authorization for tax increment financing.</b> (1) Any An urban renewal plan, as defined
16	in 7-15-4206, may contain a provision or be amended to contain a provision for the segregation and application
17	of tax increments as provided in 7-15-4283 through 7-15-4292 and this section.
18	(2) An industrial district ordinance, adopted pursuant to 7-15-4299 before [the effective date of this act],
19	or a technology district ordinance, adopted pursuant to 7-15-4295 before [the effective date of this act], or an
20	aerospace transportation and technology district ordinance adopted pursuant to 7-15-4296 before [the effective
21	date of this act] may contain a provision adopted before [the effective date of this act] or be amended to contain
22	a provision for the segregation and application of tax increments, as provided in 7-15-4282 7-15-4283 through
23	7-15-4292 and this section. After [the effective date of this act], an industrial district, technology district, or
24	aerospace transportation and technology district may not use tax increment financing unless the provision was
25	adopted before [the effective date of this act]."
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27	Section 2. Section 7-15-4283, MCA, is amended to read:
28	"7-15-4283. Definitions related to tax increment financing. For purposes of 7-15-4282 through
29	7-15-4292 and 7-15-4297 through 7-15-4299, the following definitions apply unless otherwise provided or
30	indicated by the context:



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(1) "Actual taxable value" means the taxable value of taxable property at any time, as calculated from
 the assessment roll last equalized.

3 (2) "Aerospace transportation and technology district" means a tax increment financing an aerospace
4 transportation and technology district created pursuant to 7-15-4296.

5 (3) "Aerospace transportation and technology infrastructure development project" means a project 6 undertaken within or for an aerospace transportation and technology district that consists of any of the activities 7 authorized by 7-15-4288.

8 (4) "Base taxable value" means the actual taxable value of all taxable property within an urban renewal
9 area, or a qualified industrial district, technology district, or aerospace transportation and technology district prior
10 to the effective date of a tax increment financing provision. This value may be adjusted as provided in 7-15-4287
11 or 7-15-4293.

(5) "Incremental taxable value" means the amount, if any, by which the actual taxable value at any time
exceeds the base taxable value of all property within an urban renewal area, <u>or a qualified</u> industrial district,
technology district, or aerospace transportation and technology district subject to taxation.

(6) "Industrial district" means a tax increment financing an industrial district created pursuant to
 7-15-4299.

(7) "Industrial infrastructure development project" means a project undertaken within or for an industrial
 district that consists of any of the activities authorized by 7-15-4288.

(8) "Municipality", for the purpose of an industrial district created pursuant to 7-15-4297 through
7-15-4299 and operating pursuant to 7-15-4282 through 7-15-4293 and part 43 of this chapter, means any
incorporated city or town, county, or city-county consolidated local government.

(9) "Tax increment" means the collections realized from extending the tax levies, expressed in mills, of
 all taxing bodies in which the urban renewal area, <u>or qualified</u> industrial district, technology district, aerospace
 transportation and technology district, or a part of an area or <u>qualified</u> district is located against the incremental
 taxable value.

(10) "Tax increment provision" means a provision for the segregation and application of tax increments
 as authorized by 7-15-4282 through 7-15-4292.

28 (11) "Taxes" means all taxes levied by a taxing body against property on an ad valorem basis.

(12) "Taxing body" means any city, town, county, school district, or other political subdivision or
 governmental unit of the state, including the state, that levies taxes against property within the urban renewal

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1 area, industrial district, technology district, or <del>an</del> aerospace transportation and technology district.

2 (13) "Technology district" means a tax increment financing district technology district created pursuant
 3 to 7-15-4295.

4 (14) "Technology infrastructure development project" means a project undertaken within or for a 5 technology district that consists of any of the activities authorized by 7-15-4288."

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Section 3. Section 7-15-4284, MCA, is amended to read:

8 **"7-15-4284. Filing of tax increment provisions plan or district ordinance.** (1) The clerk of the 9 municipality shall file <u>with the department of revenue</u> a certified copy of each urban renewal plan <u>and</u>, <u>if adopted</u> 10 <u>before [the effective date of this act], an</u> industrial district ordinance, <del>or</del> <u>a</u> technology district ordinance, an 11 <u>aerospace transportation and technology ordinance</u>, or an amendment to <del>any of them</del> <u>an urban renewal plan</u> 12 containing a tax increment provision <del>with the department of revenue</del>.

(2) A certified copy of each plan, ordinance, or amendment must also be filed with the clerk or other
 appropriate officer of each of the affected taxing bodies."

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Section 4. Section 7-15-4288, MCA, is amended to read:

17 "7-15-4288. Costs that may be paid by tax increment financing. The tax increments may be used
 18 by the municipality to pay the following costs of or incurred in connection with an urban renewal project and, if
 19 <u>qualified to use tax increment financing under 7-15-4282, by an</u> industrial infrastructure development project,
 20 technology infrastructure development project, or aerospace transportation and technology infrastructure
 21 development project:

- 22 (1) land acquisition;
- 23 (2) demolition and removal of structures;
- 24 (3) relocation of occupants;

(4) the acquisition, construction, and improvement of infrastructure, industrial infrastructure, technology
infrastructure, or aerospace transportation and technology infrastructure that includes streets, roads, curbs,
gutters, sidewalks, pedestrian malls, alleys, parking lots and offstreet parking facilities, sewers, sewer lines,
sewage treatment facilities, storm sewers, waterlines, waterways, water treatment facilities, natural gas lines,
electrical lines, telecommunications lines, rail lines, rail spurs, bridges, spaceports for reusable launch vehicles
with associated runways and launch, recovery, fuel manufacturing, and cargo holding facilities, publicly owned

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buildings, and any public improvements authorized by parts 41 through 45 of chapter 12, parts 42 and 43 of
chapter 13, and part 47 of chapter 14 and items of personal property to be used in connection with improvements

3 for which the foregoing costs in this subsection may be incurred;

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(5) costs incurred in connection with the redevelopment activities allowed under 7-15-4233;

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(6) acquisition of infrastructure-deficient areas or portions of areas;

6 (7) administrative costs associated with the management of the urban renewal area, industrial district,
7 technology district, or aerospace transportation and technology district;

8 (8) assemblage of land for development or redevelopment by private enterprise or public agencies,
9 including sale, initial leasing, or retention by the municipality itself at its fair value;

10 (9) the compilation and analysis of pertinent information required to adequately determine the 11 infrastructure needs of secondary, value-adding industries in the industrial district, the needs of a technology 12 infrastructure development project in the technology district, or the needs of an aerospace transportation and 13 technology infrastructure development project in the aerospace transportation and technology district;

(10) the connection of the urban renewal area, industrial district, technology district, or aerospace
 transportation and technology district to existing infrastructure outside the <u>area or</u> district;

(11) the provision of direct assistance, through industrial infrastructure development projects, technology
 development projects, or aerospace transportation and technology infrastructure development projects, to
 secondary, value-adding industries to assist in meeting their infrastructure and land needs within the district; and

(12) the acquisition, construction, or improvement of facilities or equipment for reducing, preventing,abating, or eliminating pollution."

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Section 5. Section 7-15-4290, MCA, is amended to read:

"7-15-4290. Use of property taxes and other revenue for payment of bonds. (1) (a) The tax
increment derived from an urban renewal area may be pledged for the payment of revenue bonds issued for
urban renewal projects or of general obligation bonds, revenue bonds, or special assessment bonds issued to
pay urban renewal costs described in 7-15-4288 and 7-15-4289.

(b) The <u>If qualified to use tax increment financing under 7-15-4282, the</u> tax increment derived from an
industrial district may be pledged for the payment of revenue bonds issued for industrial infrastructure
development projects or of general obligation bonds, revenue bonds, or special assessment bonds issued to pay
industrial district costs described in 7-15-4288 and 7-15-4289.

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- (c) The <u>If qualified to use tax increment financing under 7-15-4282, the</u> tax increment derived from a
   technology district may be pledged for the payment of revenue bonds issued for technology infrastructure
   development projects or of general obligation bonds, revenue bonds, or special assessment bonds issued to pay
   technology district costs described in 7-15-4288 and 7-15-4289.
- 5 (2) A municipality issuing bonds pursuant to subsection (1) may, by resolution of its governing body, 6 enter into a covenant for the security of the bondholders, detailing the calculation and adjustment of the tax 7 increment and the taxable value on which it is based and, after a public hearing, pledging or appropriating other 8 revenue of the municipality, except property taxes prohibited by subsection (3), to the payment of the bonds if 9 collections of the tax increment are insufficient.
- (3) Property taxes, except the tax increment derived from property within the area or district and tax
  collections used to pay for services provided to the municipality by a project, may not be applied to the payment
  of bonds issued pursuant to 7-15-4301 for which a tax increment has been pledged."
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Section 6. Section 7-15-4295, MCA, is amended to read:

15 "7-15-4295. Technology districts. (1) A local governing body, by ordinance and following a public 16 hearing, may authorize the creation of a technology district for technology infrastructure development projects. 17 The purpose of a technology district is for the development of infrastructure to encourage the location and 18 retention of technology development projects in the state. The tenants of a technology district must be businesses 19 or organizations engaged in technology-based operations within Montana that through the employment of 20 knowledge or labor add value to a product, process, or export service that results in the creation of new wealth 21 and for which at least 50% of the sales of the business or organization occur outside of Montana or the business 22 or organization is a manufacturing company with at least 50% of its sales to other Montana companies that have 23 50% of their sales occurring outside of Montana.

24 (2) A technology district:

- (a) must consist of a continuous area with an accurately described boundary that is large enough to host
   a diversified tenant base of multiple independent tenants;
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(b) must be zoned for use in accordance with the area growth policy, as defined in 76-1-103;

(c) may not comprise any property included within an existing urban renewal area <del>district</del> or industrial
 infrastructure development district created pursuant to this part;

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(d) must, prior to its creation, be found to be deficient in infrastructure improvements necessary for

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technology development; 1 2 (e) must, prior to its creation, have in place a formally adopted comprehensive development plan that 3 ensures that the district can host a diversified tenant base of multiple independent tenants; and 4 (f) may not be designed to serve the needs of a single district tenant or group of nonindependent tenants. 5 (3) A technology district may use tax increment financing pursuant to the provisions of 7-15-4282 through 6 7-15-4293." 7 8 Section 7. Section 7-15-4296, MCA, is amended to read: 9 **"7-15-4296.** Aerospace transportation and technology districts. (1) A local governing body, by 10 ordinance and following a public hearing, may authorize the creation of an aerospace transportation and 11 technology district for aerospace transportation and technology infrastructure development projects if the 12 proposed aerospace transportation and technology district: 13 (a)(1) consists of a continuous area with an accurately described boundary; 14 (b)(2) is zoned for use in accordance with the area master planning document; 15 (c)(3) does not include any property included within an existing urban renewal area district or industrial 16 infrastructure development district created pursuant to this part; 17 (d) is found to be deficient in infrastructure improvements for industrial development; and 18 (e)(5) has as its purpose the development of infrastructure to encourage the location and retention of 19 aerospace transportation and technology infrastructure development projects in the state. 20 (2) An aerospace transportation and technology district may use tax increment financing pursuant to the 21 provisions of 7-15-4282 through 7-15-4293." 22 23 Section 8. Section 7-15-4298, MCA, is amended to read: 24 "7-15-4298. Legislative findings. The legislature finds and declares that: 25 (1) infrastructure-deficient areas exist in the municipalities of the state and constitute a serious 26 impediment to the development of infrastructure-intensive, secondary, value-adding economic development in 27 Montana: 28 (2) municipalities lack sufficient capital to rectify the infrastructure shortage in infrastructure-deficient 29 areas, thus impeding the ability of municipalities to achieve economic growth through the development of 30 secondary, value-adding industries; and

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1	(3) the creation of industrial infrastructure is a matter of state policy and state concern because the state
2	and its municipalities will continue to suffer economic dislocation due to the lack of secondary, value-adding
3	industries <del>; and</del>
4	(4) the state's tax increment financing laws should be used to encourage the creation of areas in which
5	needed industrial infrastructure for secondary, value-adding industries could be developed."
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7	Section 9. Section 7-15-4299, MCA, is amended to read:
8	<b>"7-15-4299. Industrial districts.</b> <del>(1)</del> A local governing body, by ordinance and following a public hearing,
9	may authorize the creation of an industrial district for industrial infrastructure development projects if the proposed
10	industrial district:
11	(a)(1) consists of a continuous area with an accurately described boundary;
12	(b)(2) is zoned for light or heavy industrial use in accordance with the area master planning document;
13	(c)(3) does not include any property included within an existing urban renewal area district created
14	pursuant to this part;
15	(d)(4) is found to be deficient in infrastructure improvements for industrial development; and
16	(e)(5) has as its purpose the development of infrastructure to encourage the growth and retention of
17	secondary, value-adding industries.
18	(2) An industrial district may use tax increment financing pursuant to the provisions of 7-15-4282 through
19	<del>7-15-4293.</del> "
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21	Section 10. Section 7-15-4301, MCA, is amended to read:
22	"7-15-4301. Authorization to issue urban renewal bonds, industrial infrastructure development
23	bonds, aerospace transportation and technology infrastructure development bonds, technology
24	infrastructure development bonds, and refunding bonds. (1) A municipality may:
25	(a) issue bonds from time to time, in its discretion, to finance the undertaking of any urban renewal
26	project, and, if qualified to use tax increment financing under 7-15-4282, the undertakings of an industrial
27	infrastructuredevelopmentproject,aerospacetransportationandtechnologyinfrastructuredevelopmentproject,
28	or technology infrastructure development project under part 42 and this part, including, without limiting the
29	generality of projects, the payment of principal and interest upon any advances for surveys and plans for the
30	projects; and

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1 (b) issue refunding bonds for the payment or retirement of bonds previously issued by it. 2 (2) The bonds may not pledge the general credit of the municipality and must be made payable, as to 3 both principal and interest, solely from the income, proceeds, revenue, and funds of the municipality derived from 4 or held in connection with its undertaking and carrying out of urban renewal projects, industrial infrastructure 5 development projects, aerospace transportation and technology infrastructure development projects, or technology infrastructure development projects under part 42 and this part, including, subject to 7-15-4282, the 6 7 tax increment received and pledged by the municipality pursuant to 7-15-4282 through 7-15-4292, and, if the 8 income, proceeds, revenue, and funds of the municipality are insufficient for the payment, from other revenue of 9 the municipality pledged to the payment. Payment of the bonds, both as to principal and interest, may be further 10 secured by a pledge of any loan, grant, or contribution from the federal government or other source in aid of any 11 urban renewal projects, industrial infrastructure development projects, aerospace transportation and technology 12 infrastructure development projects, or technology infrastructure development projects of the municipality under 13 part 42 and this part or by a mortgage on all or part of any projects. 14 (3) Bonds issued under this section must be authorized by resolution or ordinance of the local governing body." 15 16 NEW SECTION. Section 11. Saving clause. [This act] does not affect rights and duties that matured, 17 18 penalties that were incurred, or proceedings that were begun before [the effective date of this act]. 19 20 NEW SECTION. Section 12.
