5	A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF
6	MONTANA STRONGLY URGING THAT TAIWAN BE PERMITTED APPROPRIATE AND MEANINGFUL
7	PARTICIPATION IN ACTIVITIES OF THE WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION.

9	WHEREAS, direct and unobstructed participation in international health cooperation forums and
10	programs is crucial for all parts of the world, especially with today's greater potential for the cross-border spread
11	of various infectious diseases; and
12	WHEREAS, Taiwan's achievements in the field of health are substantial, including one of the highest life
13	expectancy levels in Asia, maternal and infant mortality rates comparable to those of western countries, the
14	eradication of the infectious diseases of cholera, smallpox, and plague, and being the first Asian nation to
15	eradicate polio and the first country in the world to provide children with free hepatitis B vaccinations; and
16	WHEREAS, the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and its Taiwanese counterpart
17	have enjoyed close collaboration on a wide range of public health issues; and
18	WHEREAS, in recent years, Taiwan has expressed a willingness to financially and technically assist the
19	international aid and health activities supported by the World Health Organization; and
20	WHEREAS, Taiwan's population of 23 million people is larger than that of 75% of the World Health
21	Organization member states; and
22	WHEREAS, the United States, in the 1994 Taiwan Policy Review, declared its intention to support
23	Taiwan's participation in appropriate international organizations; and
24	WHEREAS, Taiwan's participation in the activities of the World Health Organization could bring many
25	benefits to the state of health not only in Taiwan but also regionally and globally.

27	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
28	STATE OF MONTANA:
29	That the Montana Legislature strongly urge that Taiwan be permitted appropriate and meaningfu
30	participation in the activities of the World Health Organization.
