

Hill County Justice Court

Justice of the Peace Terry Stoppa

The following actions involving adults were recently recorded in Hill County Justice Court. They do not include cases with fines or forfeited bonds of less than \$59 for criminal violations or \$99 for traffic violations.

Laura L. Long, no age given, was fined \$100 and ordered to pay \$20.89 restitution for issuing a bad check.

Gene C. Johnson, 28, was fined \$150 and given a 90-day suspended jail sentence for reckless driving, amended from operating a motor vehicle with a blood-alcohol concentration of 0.08 percent or greater, second offense.

Della Rose Morsette, 29, was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but two days suspended and fined \$250 for driving a motor vehicle while her privilege to do so was suspended or revoked.

Jacob Andrew Brown, 22, forfeited \$250 bond for failing to carry or exhibit proof of liability insurance in a vehicle, first offense.

Darmon Lael Trahant, 49, was fined \$350 and given a 10-day suspended jail sentence for operating a motor vehicle with a blood-alcohol concentration of 0.08 percent or greater, first offense, amended from driving under the influence of alcohol, first offense.

Ryan Douglas Guazzo, 21, was fined \$350 for operating a motor vehicle with a blood-alcohol concentration of 0.02 percent while under 21 years of age, first offense, amended from DUI, first offense.

Mark Anthony Mayner, 41, was fined \$250 and given a six-month suspended jail sentence for driving without a valid driver's license, amended from driving a motor vehicle while his privilege to do so was suspended or revoked.

David Scott Forrest, 28, forfeited \$350 bond for operating a motor vehicle without liability insurance in effect, second offense.

Santana Marie Lieberg, 28, was fined \$350 and given a 10-day suspended jail sentence for operating a motor vehicle with a blood-alcohol concentration of 0.08 percent or greater, first offense, amended from DUI, first offense. Lieberg was fined \$250 and given a 10-day suspended jail sentence for operating a motor vehicle without liability insurance in effect, first offense.

Shea Cole Pomeroy, 31, was sentenced to 10 days in jail with all but four days suspended and fined \$300 for failing to carry or exhibit proof of liability insurance, first offense.

Alvina Friede, 37, was fined \$250 and given a six-month suspended jail sentence for failing to give notice of an accident by the quickest means.

Daniel Wayne Monk, 32, was fined \$300 and given a six-month suspended jail sentence for criminal possession of drug paraphernalia.

Carmela LaMere, 32, was fined \$250 for driving a motor vehicle while her privilege to do so was suspended or revoked.

Kathleen Lorraine Adams, 29, was fined \$350 and given a 10-day suspended jail sentence for failing to carry or exhibit proof of liability insurance in a vehicle, second offense.

Melinda Rae Healy, 21, was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but two days suspended, fined \$100 and ordered to pay \$210.90 restitution for theft, first offense.

Paul Shane Huston, 40, was fined \$100 for careless driving.

Kathy Watkins Beck, 44, was fined \$250 and given a 10-day suspended jail sentence for operating a motor vehicle without liability insurance in effect, first offense.

Josephine Wilkie, 28, was fined \$350 and given a 10-day suspended jail sentence for operating a motor vehicle without liability insurance in effect, second offense.

Jonathan R. Fourcolors, 29, was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but two days suspended and fined \$250 for driving a motor vehicle while his privilege to do so was suspended or revoked.

Fourcolors was fined \$250 and given a 10-day suspended jail sentence for operating a motor vehicle without liability insurance in effect, first offense. Later, Fourcolors was fined \$350 and given a 10-day suspended jail sentence for operating a motor vehicle without liability insurance in effect, second offense.

Sarah Mae Hacke, 25, forfeited \$250 bond for operating a motor vehicle without liability insurance in effect, first offense.

Ileen K. Standingrock, 49, was fined \$200 and given a six-month suspended jail sentence for theft, first offense.

Cameron J. Eagleman, 24, was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but three days suspended and fined \$350 for assault.

Patrick Ryan Lowe, 51, was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but two days suspended and fined \$250 for driving a motor vehicle while his privilege to do so was suspended or revoked.

Sable Rose Littlesea, 20, was fined \$100 for minor-in-possession-of-alcohol charge, first offense.

Lawrence Eugene Normandy, 38, was sentenced to 15 days in jail for criminal possession of drug paraphernalia.

Elva Vandessell, 64, was fined \$300, given a six-month suspended jail sentence and ordered to pay \$10.99 restitution for theft, second offense.

Christopher William Cooper, 27, was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but two days suspended and fined \$100 for obstructing a peace officer.

Timothy Scott Mavis, 26, was sentenced to 10 days in jail with all but two days suspended and

fined \$150 for failing to carry or exhibit proof of liability insurance in a vehicle, first offense. Mavis was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but two days suspended and fined \$150 for driving a motor vehicle while his privilege to do so was suspended or revoked.

He was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but two days suspended and fined \$100 for criminal possession of drug paraphernalia. He was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but two days suspended and fined \$400 for criminal possession of dangerous drugs, marijuana, second offense.

Timothy Michael Koop, 19, was fined \$200 and given a six-month suspended jail sentence for driving without a valid driver's license.

Elliott James The Boy, 21, was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but two days suspended and fined \$100 for assault.

Harvey Blair Friede Jr., 26, was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but two days suspended and fined \$100 for obstructing a peace officer.

Corinne Lee Briere, 32, was fined \$200, given a six-month suspended jail sentence and ordered to pay \$23.99 restitution for theft, first offense.

William Michael Abeita, 31, was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but five days suspended, fined \$300 and ordered to pay \$346.66 restitution for criminal mischief. Abeita was sentenced to four days in jail for disorderly conduct and ordered to pay \$346.66 restitution.

Crystal Dawn Horn, 34, pleaded no contest to a charge of theft, first offense, and was fined \$200, given a six-month suspended jail sentence and ordered to pay \$14.99 restitution.

Heidi M. Exley, 32, was fined \$100, given a six-month suspended jail sentence and ordered to pay \$8.99 for theft, first offense.

Tuesday Sutherland, 47, was sentenced to 20 days in jail for theft, third offense.

Kendall Chase Parker, 25, was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but two days suspended and fined \$150 for driving a motor vehicle while his privilege to do so was suspended or revoked.

Delia Rose Morsette, 29, was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but one day suspended, fined \$250 and ordered to pay \$4.19 restitution for theft, second offense.

Russell Lee Zumbaum Jr., 28, was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but 10 days suspended and fined \$500 for operating a motor vehicle without liability insurance in effect, third or subsequent offense.

Robert William Bradshaw, 23, was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but one day suspended and fined \$400 for DUI, first offense.

Christen Jade Stump, 19, was fined \$200 and given a six-month suspended jail sentence for driving without a valid driver's

license. Gregory Dale Munnell, 27, was sentenced to six days in jail for criminal mischief.

Keleey Scott Darlow, 25, was fined \$100 for unlawful possession of an open alcohol container in a motor vehicle on a highway.

Mallory Rose Baker, 21, was fined \$350 and given a 10-day suspended jail sentence for operating a motor vehicle without liability insurance in effect, second offense.

Floyd Thomas Crossguns, 46, was fined \$350 and given a 10-day suspended jail sentence for operating a motor vehicle without liability insurance in effect, second offense.

Nicole Lynn Brown, 21, was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but four days suspended for obstructing a peace officer.

Aloysius Dexter Doney, 40, was sentenced to seven days in jail for criminal possession of drug paraphernalia.

Deena Nicole Sunchild, 18, was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but one day suspended, fined \$200 and ordered to pay \$31.45 on the first of two charges of theft, first offense and fined \$300 with the same sentence and restitution on the second.

Scott P. Scheffelmear, 36, was fined \$200 and given a six-month suspended jail sentence for driving without a valid driver's license.

Denise Marie Friede, 32, was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but two days suspended and fined \$250 for driving a motor vehicle while her privilege to do so was suspended or revoked.

James Martin Flying, 24, was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but seven days suspended and fined \$650 for DUI, second offense. Flying was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but two days suspended and fined \$150 for driving a motor vehicle while his privilege to do so was suspended or revoked.

Moses Eugene Lawrence, 23, was sentenced to 365 days in jail with all but one day suspended and fined \$200 for partner or family member assault. Lawrence was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but one day suspended and fined \$500 for DUI, first offense, and sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but two days suspended for endangering the welfare of a child, first violation. Lawrence was sentenced to 180 days in jail with all but 10 days suspended and fined \$500 for failing to carry or exhibit proof of liability insurance in a vehicle, third or subsequent offense.

During the past few weeks, Judge Stoppa resolved 140 more traffic citations involving juveniles or resulting in fines of fewer than \$99 each, and handled five additional criminal violations involving juveniles or resulting in fines of fewer than \$59 each. The judge also resolved one GVV offense resulting in a fine and had 33 tickets dismissed.
