FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

1. Applications will continue to be filed for Certificates of Environmental Compatibility for projects covered under the Major Facilities Siting Act.
2. Filing fees for review of applications will be deposited with the state, in whole or in part, prior to the start of work by the state, and will be adequate to pay the costs of review by DEQ and other state agencies.
3. Work performed by the state to develop information or provide services will be contracted and paid for in installments.
4. No interest will be paid on refunds of unused application fee balances; no such payments have been made in recent years, and this provision of current law may never have been utilized.
5. Therefore, this bill has no fiscal impact to the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ).
