FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

1. Currently, legislators may submit an unlimited number of bill draft requests prior to December 5 preceding a regular legislative session. Beginning December 5, the legislator may submit seven additional bill draft requests. Five of the seven requests must be used prior to the convening of session or they're lost. No more than two bill draft requests may be used once session convenes.
2. The number of bill draft requests submitted by individual legislators, and the number of legislators that submit more than 25 bill draft requests, is not constant from session to session. Through January 17, 2007, 22 legislators have requested more than 25 bill drafts.
3. There are no reasonable assumptions which can be made related to an increase or decrease in the total number of bill draft requests, the topic or magnitude of legislation, or other factors affecting workload or production costs.
4. Therefore, the Legislative Branch has no basis with which to calculate a fiscal impact.
