FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks (FWP)

1. The Golden Years pass program was suspended in 1989 and all users had to be 65 or above to be eligible. Therefore, current valid users have to be at least 82 years of age.
2. An estimated 6,400 passes were issued and they are not transferable.
3. Ten percent (640) continue to use state parks for day use. Camping is already free.
4. It is estimated that less than 1 % (6) of those persons annually arrive in vehicles with out-of-state plates.
5. Therefore, it is concluded that the fiscal impact of this bill is negligible or zero.
