FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

1. The DEQ will continue to receive applications for permits under Metal Mine Reclamation Act, reflecting market prices and exploration successes in the state. The cost of plans within the permit applications to minimize contact between water and mineralized material, or to isolate reactive waste rock will be the responsibility of applicants.
2. The DEQ will continue to determine, based on site visits and document reviews, that existing reclamation plans will occasionally need to be modified. The cost of additional environmental analysis for reclamation plan revisions will be met by existing DEQ budgets or by permittees.
3. Additional bond amounts for long-term water treatment will be the responsibility of applicants or permittees. The cost of interim reclamation plans, bond calculations by third parties, and interim bonds calculated by third parties will be the responsibility of permittees. Any agency expenses will be met from existing budgets.
4. This bill has no fiscal impact to the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ).
