**Description of Fiscal Impact:** The bill clarifies which construction projects the Montana Heritage Preservation and Development Commission need Architectural and Engineering review and increases the amount of construction projects that do not require legislative consent from \$200,000 to \$300,000.

### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### Assumptions:

1. This bill has no fiscal impact to the state.

#### Technical Notes:

1. Page 1, line 28 and Page 2, line 3: establish a \$300,000 cost for commission projects requiring legislative consent, but does not amend 18-2-102, MCA, which establishes \$150,000 for all projects. It may be necessary to modify the legislative limits for the commission in 18-2-102 (2), MCA, rather than 22-3-1003, MCA.
2. Page 2, line 1: The intent of "funding...must pass through directly to the commission." seems ambiguous. It does not define what funds. State funds are generally appropriated to an agency that has responsibility for management of the appropriated funds.
