

Dear Honorable Chairman McNutt and Members of the House Appropriations Committee:

RE: Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes support for full funding for Non-Beneficiary students attending Tribal Colleges

This letter is written to address the issue with Salish Kootenai College (SKC) and all Colleges of Montana, in their efforts to secure \$3,014.00 for each full time non-beneficiary student attending one of our State's local community colleges.

Non beneficiary students are very important to Tribal Colleges as they provide diversity and perspective to the intellectual dialogue that is encouraged in each and every classroom. The sharing of knowledge and perspectives at the local level is a benefit to all students as we empower students to contribute to their local communities.

There is a richness and an expanded opportunity for education when our classrooms are filled with diverse community members with different backgrounds. This is what America is based upon – a melting pot of ideas which enables us to learn and thereby strive for excellence.

Our Tribal College is extremely proud to open our doors to all students in our community. However, we must be able to sustain that opportunity financially. In our efforts to provide this opportunity for expanded learning, it is very important to have full funding for the non-beneficiary students.

I sincerely hope that you will do all you can do to see that the full appropriation is made for all full time non-beneficiaries.

In the last fiscal year, this program provided over \$500,000.00 to our Tribal College, SKC. These funds enable the college to offer expanded work force development programs.

These expanded work force development programs benefit the larger community as students enter the work force with expanded skill sets.


The benefit of quality work force development is to the Tribal and non-Tribal community alike. Work force development is economic development!

Dear Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee:

I teach GED classes at the Department of Academic Success for Salish Kootenai College. I cannot stress enough the importance of funding Adult Education. I would like to share with you stories of some of my students.

Today I learned that a 57-year-old man who has not shown improvement on his TABE has only eaten one meal a week for quite some time. He broke down while he informed me that he was unable to think straight when he takes the test because he is starving. He used to have a job at the mill, pay taxes, and contribute to society. The mill closed down and he has lost his job. He is trying to pass the GED so that he can return to work.

Last week, I had a single father of two boys (37 years old) who was not allowed to go to work until he obtained his GED. He has had the same position for years and suddenly was told GED or no job. Thankfully, he passed his GED last Saturday and was able to return to work.

In my class currently is a 63-year-old woman whose husband decided that he needed a younger woman. She is now forced to enter the workforce with very little skills or education. She is currently pursuing her GED.

I could continue with the stories, but I wanted you to get a picture of the people our program impacts. These people have contributed over the years. They are not merely young adults who did not cut it in school. Each person has his or her own story. They are diligently working towards their GED. Eliminating funding for adult education will only perpetuate more poverty.

Please continue to fund Adult Basic Education.

You're taking the money from this program to give to the youth, How is a parent supposed to provide for that youth or to reward that youth for good grades or good behavior in school if they cannot get a good paying job from, lack of Education. So I honestly feel in the end, that it is most important that our elders or our children whom are seeking their GED are able to attain it when they need it. Who are we to take from people in their time of need. Thank you for listening and taking time out of your day to read this. I hope that what I have written can at least touch one of your hearts.


Dear Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee:

The SKC ABLE program is giving me the tools I need to study for my GED, especially in the area of math. I dropped out of school at 16, got married and had a child and have been raising babies ever since, mostly in controlling abusive homes which enabled me to put my education, dreams, aspirations etc. on the back burner. Now that I have come out of the abusive and dysfunctional home, I have been in for way too long there is hope for me since the ABLE program exists. When I came here head down and ashamed of my self for not even graduating high school or receiving my GED still at age 35, I got nothing but the very best treatment. I was greeted with dignity and respect and have never been made to feel dumb, less than, or any of the many other names others have used to label me in the past and some that I have used to label myself. This program has not only given me a place and tools to study, but it has given me the self esteem to get up every morning and say to my self that I can do this, (and at my own pace too). I don't know what I would do if this program didn't exist, I would probably still be putting off my education for someone or something else. Please reconsider cutting all Adult Education funds; this would be a huge loss to our state's educational system.



I am writing to tell you how my husband, has improved in the Adult Education Program. My Husband started working at Plum Creek Mill in Pablo Mt. on April 1974. A Diploma was not required they needed just a working man. My husband has been illiterate. The first time we started dating, in the fall of 1966. It was hard for me to realize that a person could go through school, and not have any idea on how to write or do arithmetic. I helped him through the years, and so did our 3 daughters. When he decided to take the boiler license, I read the manual over and over for several months. The time to take the test, he had to have the test read to him. He passed both the 3rd and 2nd class. He is now running the boiler. Notes have to be written down on what happens through the day. He is frustrated, so I am called every day he works, to spell words to him on when the boiler breaks down, or has problems that need to be fixed. The next co-worker would also help him with writing down sentences. Since the Mill has closed, any job requires a GED or High School Diploma.

Now if you cut the Able Funds, my husband will lose everything that he has learned since July 7th 2009. I have seen a lot of improvement in his math, & story problems. My husband has come a long way since going to Adult Education, the teachers take time and interest in where the Adults need help. The spelling of words is where he needs a lot of help. I have purchased a spell check for him, and he finds that helps. Our daughters helped their father sound out words. This is where he learned how to read the paper or magazine. His reading has also improved. He looks forward to going to school every morning. At 62 years old I admire him, for striving towards fulfilling his education. This program not only has helped him in education, but also being around other Adults. He was always a loner and now interacts with helping other Adults in the program. This program has helped other Adults to work towards receiving their GED. My husband will have his GED, if you keep the program going and not cut the fundings. Every Adult needs to have an education.

The State of Montana invests less than \$90.00 per student state wide in related ABE services to produce an individual who will obtain employment (with GED in hand) and then contribute to the tax base of the State. What a wise investment!

Salish Kootenai College (SKC) and Lake County area will suffer if this program is eliminated. They will lose 12+ positions and 1/3 of the student population if ABE funds are not continued.

For SKC the ABE program serves 1,500 students per year with academic assessment and instructional services. 70% of these are Native American. 30% of those served go on to obtain a degree which equates to greater contributions to the tax base of Montana.

Salish Kootenai College (SKC) and Lake County area will suffer if this program is eliminated. They will lose 12+ positions and 1/3 of the student population if ABE funds are not continued.

For SKC the ABE program serves 1,500 students per year with academic assessment and instructional services. 70% of these are Native American. 30% of those served go on to obtain a degree which equates to greater contributions to the tax base of Montana.
