

Testimony in favor of HB347

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REQUIRING A K-12 PROGRAM OF INSTRUCTION IN CIVIC EDUCATION; REQUIRING THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION TO DEVELOP, ADMINISTER, AND SUPERVISE THE PROGRAM AND RECOMMEND TO THE BOARD OF PUBLIC EDUCATION BASIC COURSE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE PROGRAM; AND AMENDING SECTION 20-2-121, MCA."

Chairman and members of the committee, my name is Roger Nummerdor and I live in Helena. I am here representing myself, and I strongly support HB 347.

James Madison, our fourth President, and sometimes referred to as "the father of the Constitution" stated "A well-instructed people alone can be permanently a free people." George Washington stated "a primary object...should be the education of our youth in the science of government. In a republic, what species of knowledge can be equally important? What duty more pressing...than communicating it to those who are to be the future guardians of the liberties of the country?"
