


Kalispell Public Schools Reading CRT Scores Grades 4, 8 and 10 2004-2010




To address our student's Reading Achievement we have done the following:

Provide for small group instruction in our elementary schools. Our small, flexible Reading groups are led by teachers, tutors and instructional paraprofessionals. Our success is largely due to our ability to keep the reading group size to a minimum.

Provide Reading Specialists in Grades 6, 7, 8 and at each of our high schools who coordinate a Reading Intervention Program in which students are provided small group, individualized instruction by teachers, tutors and paraprofessionals.

Added All Day, Everyday Kindergarten which has provided our youngest students with additional Reading instruction time that has resulted in higher achievement levels in our primary grades.


Kalispell Middle School 8th grade CRT Results 2004-2010



Our Middle School is structured around a Small Learning Community philosophy in which students are grouped into teams so that their instruction is shared by 5 teachers representing each of the following subject areas: Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Science and Health/PE.

The teaming concept allows our teachers to get to better know their students unique abilities and challenges, providing greater opportunity to meet their individual instructional and social/emotional needs.

Kalispell Public Schools Percentage of Freshmen Enrolled in Alg 1 or above 2008-2010




We have pushed hard to assure that more of our students are prepared to take Algebra 1 during their freshman year of high school. This has required additional focus upon Mathematics in our entire system.

Our elementary schools provide leveled grouping opportunities for students to assure that they are getting mathematics instruction that meets their needs.

Our middle school has designed a Math Intervention period for students who are in need of additional mathematics instruction.

Our high schools have created Math Labs to provide an additional period of instruction for students struggling with Mathematics.

Kalispell Public Schools Freshmen Failure Percentage 1st Semester 2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11




Freshman Academies have been created at each of our high schools. This is a small learning community model similar to that in place at Kalispell Middle School.

The teaming concept allows our teachers to get to better know their students' unique abilities and challenges, providing greater opportunity to meet their individual instructional needs.

Greater focus upon understanding the unique needs of at-risk students, coupled with the increased ability to create meaningful teacher/student relationships has helped us to decrease our failure rate, ultimately helping us to keep kids in school.

Kalispell Public Schools Grade Distributions End of First Semester 2008-2009, 2009-2010, 2010-2011 Grades 9-12




Administrators and teachers spend considerable time monitoring the progress of each of our district's students. This increased monitoring has provided greater opportunity to prevent student failures in individual courses.

Interventions in Reading, Mathematics and other subject areas have been designed to help improve upon our students' academic success.

Credit retrieval options have been created to allow students to pass courses they may have previously failed, providing them a greater opportunity to stay on track towards graduation.

Our International Baccalaureate and Advanced Placement programs are designed to serve our students most willing to take courses of the highest rigor.
