Main Street¹ is a community driven, comprehensive approach to revitalizing older, traditional business districts.


Improved downtown and community image leading to

Results 2009 and 2010

17 communities and growing
47 New Businesses
55 Building Renovations = \$31.4 Million
11 New Construction = \$9.9 Million
47 Public Improvements = \$1.1 Million
12 New Housing = \$5.2 Million
140 Promotions = \$6.3 Million
71 new jobs created
Over 35,000 volunteer hours
