A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT DECLARING THAT THE PATIENT PROTECTION AND AFFORDABLE CARE ACT OF 2010 AND THE HEALTH CARE AND EDUCATION RECONCILIATION ACT OF 2010 ARE INVALID, NULL, VOID, AND UNENFORCEABLE IN MONTANA; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR ENFORCEMENT OR ATTEMPTED ENFORCEMENT; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE." BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Chairman and members of the committee, my name is Roger Nummerdor and I stand proudly as a Montanan in support of this Bill. Once again Montanans are ready to standup and show that "States Rights" really means something in the Constitution of the United States. We did this when the Federal Government tried to force "Real ID" on us and now it is time to show them that they cannot force "Obama Care" on the citizens of Montana without our consent.

Obama Care would force an increased burden of at least \$175 million additional taxes on the taxpayers of Montana due to increased participation in Medicaid. Obama Care would add 1500 new agencies, agencies like the EPA and OSA, to the already bloated Federal Government. Obama Care would force all Montanans to buy healthcare whether we want it or not.

I could list hundreds of other things Obama Care will do that will hurt us, if we do not standup and show the Federal Government that they have overstepped their mandate. I firmly believe that Obama Care has nothing to do with improving our healthcare, but only adds more power to the Federal government and with that increased power, more cost and intrusion into the lives of all Americans.

History shows that just two years after the ratification of the Constitution, Congress transmitted 12 proposed amendments to the States, ten of which were adopted in 1791, and now make up our Bill of Rights. This was done to prevent misconstruction or abuse of its powers, that further declaratory and restrictive clauses should be added. Among those was Amendment 10. This Amendment reads; the powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people.

This bill enforces that our States Rights supersede those of the Federal government, I strongly support this bill and ask that your committee pass it.
