3 (c) The chief or designated official shall subscribe and verify under oath, before a notary, that the fire
4 company and members qualified under 19-17-108 and [section 7].

5 (d) The board shall maintain the certificate for the purpose of establishing service for members and 6 eligibility for benefits.

7 (3) The roster must be signed by the fire chief or designated official, filed with the board, and contain 8 information in writing that provides the names of the fire company, its date of organization, officers, and roll of 9 active and inactive members for the current fiscal year. A roster may be updated to report new members but may 10 not be retroactive.

(4) A membership card must be completed and filed with the board for each member who was a member
on or before July 1, 2011, and for each new member who joins after July 1, 2011.

(5) The current fire chief shall file any late or amended annual certificates and the associated certified training records within 3 years of the original annual certificate due date. An annual certificate may be amended only once. The board shall consider and may approve late filings. Information provided to the board by the fire chief must be in accordance with the board's rules.

17 (6) The current fire chief may request to appear before the board for consideration of the request to file18 a late or amended annual certificate.

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20 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 12. Corrections, audits, and penalties. (1) If fraud or error results in a 21 member, surviving spouse, or dependent child receiving more or less of a benefit than that to which the member, 22 surviving spouse, or dependent child is entitled, then on the discovery of the error the board shall correct the 23 credit for service and, if necessary, equitably adjust the payments.
