7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

9	Section 1. Section 31-3-112, MCA, is amended to read:
10	"31-3-112. Obsolete information. (1) No Except as provided in subsection (2), a consumer reporting
11	agency may not make any consumer report containing any of the following items of information:
12	(1)(a) bankruptcies which that , from the date of adjudication of the most recent bankruptcy, antedate the
13	report by more than 14 years;
14	(2) (b) suits and judgments which <u>that</u> , from <u>the</u> date of entry, antedate the report by more than 7 years
15	or until the governing statute of limitations has expired, whichever is the longer period;
16	(3) (c) paid tax liens which <u>that</u> , from <u>the</u> date of payment, antedate the report by more than 7 years;
17	(4)(d) accounts placed for collection or charged to profit and loss which that antedate the report by more
18	than 7 years;
19	(5) (e) records of arrest , or indictment , or conviction of <u>for a</u> crime which, <u>that,</u> from <u>the</u> date of disposition ,
20	<u>or</u> release, or parole, antedate the report by more than 7 years; <u>or</u>
21	(6)(f) any other adverse item of information which that antedates the report by more than 7 years.
22	(2) There is no time limit requiring expungement from a consumer report of convictions or pleadings of
23	no contest regarding a crime."
