10	WHEREAS, the 2009 Legislature provided funding for coordination of transition activities among Montana			
11	families, nonprofit organizations, and governmental agencies; and			
12	WHEREAS, based on the number of high school-aged students with disabilities, the funds averaged our			
13	to an investment of \$7.46 per student for the transition to adult life; and			
14	WHEREAS, the funding supported regional efforts focused on transition needs, job-shadowing			
15	opportunities, a statewide conference, and a website that provides information to youth and their families or			
16	issues related to transition from youth to ad	lulthood and independe	nt living.

18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

20	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Appropriation. (1) There is appropriated \$50,000 in each year of the			
21	biennium beginning July 1, 2011, from the general fund to the department of public health and human services			
22	to be used for transition coordination activities as follows:			
23	(a) coordinating a statewide transitions conference;			
24	(b) maintaining the Montana youth	transitions website;		
25	(c) coordinating a day devoted	to mentoring students	with disabilities and providing associated	
26	job-shadowing activities;			
27	(d) developing and implementing r	(d) developing and implementing regional transition meetings;		
28	(e) establishing a system of coordination and communication with the governor's transition task force

30	(f) providing quarterly reports in a fo	ormat that reflects progr	ress on the purposes of the program and the
