4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ALLOWING ELECTION JUDGES TO BEGIN PREPARING
5	ABSENTEE BALLOTS BEFORE ELECTION DAY; AND AMENDING SECTION 13-13-241, MCA."
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7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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9	Section 1. Section 13-13-241, MCA, is amended to read:
10	"13-13-241. Examination of absentee ballot return envelopes deposit of absentee and unvoted
11	ballots. (1) (a) After an absentee ballot is received, an election administrator shall compare the signature of the
12	elector or elector's agent on the absentee ballot request with the signature on the absentee ballot return envelope.
13	(b) If the elector is legally registered and the signature on the return envelope matches the signature on
14	the absentee ballot application, the election administrator or an election judge shall handle the ballot as a regular
15	ballot.
16	(c) (i) If the elector is provisionally registered and the signature on the return envelope matches the
17	signature on the absentee ballot application, the election administrator or an election judge shall open the outer
18	return envelope and determine whether the elector's voter identification and eligibility information, if enclosed
19	pursuant to 13-13-201, is sufficient pursuant to rules adopted under 13-2-109 to legally register the elector.
20	(ii) If the voter identification and eligibility information is sufficient to legally register the elector, the ballot
21	must be handled as a regular ballot.
22	(iii) If voter identification or eligibility information was not enclosed or the information enclosed is
23	insufficient to legally register the elector, the ballot must be handled as a provisional ballot under 13-15-107.
24	(2) If a voted absentee ballot has not been placed in a secrecy envelope, the election administrator shall
25	place the ballot in a secrecy envelope without examining the ballot.
26	(3) In a primary election, unvoted party ballots must be separated from the secrecy envelopes and
27	handled without being removed from their enclosure envelopes.
28	(4) If an elector's ballot is to be handled as a provisional ballot, the election administrator shall notify the
29	absentee elector by mail or by the most expedient method available under rules adopted by the secretary of state
30	that the elector's identification or eligibility information was insufficient and that the elector's ballot will be treated
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as a provisional ballot until the elector provides sufficient information, pursuant to rules adopted by the secretary
of state. If the elector is notified by mail, the election administrator shall provide a self-addressed return envelope
along with a description of the information necessary for the absentee elector to reclassify the provisional ballot
as a regular ballot.

5 (5) If the signature on the absentee ballot return envelope does not match the signature on the absentee 6 ballot request form, the election administrator shall notify the elector, either by first-class mail or the most 7 expedient method available under rules adopted by the secretary of state, and inform the elector that the elector 8 may verify the signature, after proof of identification, by mail or in person at the election administrator's office prior 9 to 8 p.m. on election day.

(6) The elector may verify the signature by affirming that the signature is in fact the elector's or by
 completing a new registration card containing the elector's current signature or by filing a new agent designation
 form.

(7) If an elector notified pursuant to subsection (5) fails to verify the signature before 8 p.m. on election
day, the ballot must be handled as a provisional ballot under 13-15-107.

(8) After receiving an absentee ballot secrecy envelope, without opening the secrecy envelope <u>but not</u>
 <u>sooner than 3 1 business days DAY before election day</u>, the election judges shall <u>MAY, IN THE PRESENCE OF A POLL</u>
 <u>WATCHER</u>, on election day <u>open the secrecy envelope and</u> place the secrecy envelope <u>ballot</u> in the proper,
