8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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10	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Appropriation. (1) There is appropriated to the to the department of public
11	health and human services \$8,530,676 in each year of the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, to increase the
12	wages paid to direct-care and ancillary workers who are employed by medicaid-funded providers of community
13	services and who earn less than \$11 an hour.
14	(2) Money is appropriated as follows in fiscal year 2012:
15	(a) \$12,197 of state special revenue and \$23,878 of federal funds to the addictive and mental disorders
16	division;
17	(b) \$1,263,615 of state general fund and \$2,477,104 of federal funds to the developmental disabilities
18	program;
19	(c) \$241,698 of state general fund and \$473,174 of federal funds to the children's mental health bureau;
20	and
21	(d) \$1,365,590 of state general fund and \$2,673,422 of federal funds to the senior and long-term care
22	division.
23	(3) Money is appropriated as follows in fiscal year 2013:
24	(a) \$12,359 of state special revenue and \$23,716 of federal funds to the addictive and mental disorders
25	division;
26	(b) \$1,281,571 of state general fund and \$2,459,149 of federal funds to the developmental disabilities
27	program;
28	(c) \$244,915 of state general fund and \$469,957 of federal funds to the children's mental health bureau;
29	and
30	(d) \$1,383,765 of state general fund and \$2,655,246 of federal funds to the senior and long-term care
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1 division.

2 (4) The money must be used to provide a wage increase of 50 cents per hour, including benefits, to direct-care and ancillary workers in fiscal year 2012 and to maintain the wage increase in fiscal year 2013.

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5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Section 2. Effective date.** [This act] is effective July 1, 2011.
