BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if an end-user fee is proposed, it be equitable and efficient, be based on verifiable actual costs that are not proprietary or confidential, and be associated only with the costs of a statewide interoperable public safety communications system in Montana.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any study involve the participation of local, state, federal, and tribal stakeholders, representatives of public safety user groups, including county commissioners, law enforcement officials, disaster and emergency services coordinators, and 9-1-1 and emergency response groups, and other stakeholders with an interest in the statewide interoperable public safety communications system.

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if the study is assigned to staff, any findings or conclusions be 18 presented to and reviewed by an appropriate committee designated by the Legislative Council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all aspects of the study, including presentation and review
 requirements, be concluded prior to September 15, 2012.
