4	A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF
5	MONTANA REQUESTING AN INTERIM STUDY TO EVALUATE THE FEASIBILITY OF MANAGING
6	MONTANA'S AGRICULTURAL AND FORESTED LANDS FOR TERRESTRIAL CARBON SEQUESTRATION.
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8	WHEREAS, effectively managing agricultural and forested lands in Montana can increase the amount
9	of carbon that can be stored in the soil; and
10	WHEREAS, carbon offset trading is creating new, potential financial incentives for landowners to maintain
11	forests and agricultural lands and can provide another source of revenue for many foresters, farmers, and
12	ranchers of the state of Montana.
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14	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
15	STATE OF MONTANA:
16	That the Legislative Council be requested to designate an appropriate interim committee, pursuant to
17	section 5-5-217, MCA, or direct sufficient staff resources to:
18	(1) evaluate the feasibility of terrestrial carbon sequestration in forests, agricultural lands, and
19	conservation areas in Montana;
20	(2) analyze estimates of the costs and benefits of carbon-enhancing land uses and management
21	practices in Montana;
22	(3) evaluate incentives for private landowners to manage forests and agricultural lands to increase their
23	carbon capture potential;
24	(4) evaluate the state's ability to use or lease state trust lands for terrestrial carbon sequestration; and
25	(5) identify public policy options for increasing terrestrial carbon sequestration on private and public
26	lands.
27	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the committee engage diverse groups, including Montana's university
28	system, in identifying opportunities to implement optimal terrestrial carbon sequestration strategies for Montana.
29	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if the study is assigned to staff, any findings or conclusions be
30	presented to and reviewed by an appropriate committee designated by the Legislative Council.
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- 1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all aspects of the study, including presentation and review 2 requirements, be concluded prior to September 15, 2012.
- 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the final results of the study, including any findings, conclusions,
- 4 comments, or recommendations of the appropriate committee, be reported to the 63rd Legislature.
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
