| 7  | WHEREAS, the men and women who came to Montana during the westward expansion of the United                          |
| 8  | States, including cowboys, ranchers, pioneers, miners, and peace officers and their families, lived by an unwritter |
| 9  | code of conduct; and  |
| 10 | WHEREAS, this unwritten code of conduct was built upon the principles of honesty, loyalty, hard work                |
| 11 | and courage; and  |
| 12 | WHEREAS, those who lived by this unwritten code of conduct valued personal integrity, self-reliance                 |
| 13 | and accountability; and   |
| 14 | WHEREAS, these early residents also recognized that cooperation and fair dealing were necessary to                  |
| 15 | their survival and success; and   |
| 16 | WHEREAS, this unwritten code of conduct became known as the Code of the West; and                                   |
| 17 | WHEREAS, author James P. Owen distilled the Code of the West into 10 principles to live by; and                     |
| 18 | WHEREAS, Montanans can derive wisdom and guidance from the Code of the West, which remains                          |
| 19 | relevant to present and future generations of Montanans.  |

| 21 | NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF                                      |
| 22 | MONTANA:  |
| 23 | That the House of Representatives of the State of Montana adopts the Code of the West, as derived from              |
| 24 | the book Cowboy Ethics: What Wall Street Can Learn from the Code of the West by James P. Owen and                   |
| 25 | summarized as follows, as the model code of conduct for the State of Montana:                                       |
| 26 | (1) Live each day with courage.   |
| 27 | (2) Take pride in your work.  |
| 28 | (3) Always finish what you start.   |
| 29 | (4) Do what has to be done.   |
| 30 | (5) Be tough, but fair.   |
