1 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 25 2 INTRODUCED BY L. MOSS 3 A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF 4 5 MONTANA EXTENDING CONDOLENCES TO THE PEOPLE OF JAPAN AFFECTED BY THE MARCH 2011 6 EARTHQUAKE AND ENSUING TSUNAMI AND NUCLEAR POWER PLANT PROBLEMS AND REQUESTING 7 THE PRESIDENT, CONGRESS, AND OTHERS TO PROVIDE ALL FEASIBLE SUPPORT TO THOSE 8 AFFECTED. 9 10 WHEREAS, the unprecedented scale of the March 2011 earthquakes and tsunami in Japan has resulted 11 in countless lives lost, injuries, severe environmental degradation, and destruction beyond imagination; and 12 WHEREAS, the effects of the disaster impact the people of Japan and all people worldwide from a 13 humanitarian standpoint, as well as economically and financially, with the potential for impacts from nuclear 14 radiation beyond the disaster zone in Japan; and 15 WHEREAS, since 1982 the State of Montana has had a sister state relationship with Kumamoto 16 Prefecture, which is located on one of the southern Japanese islands and was not in the immediate disaster zone 17 but was not unaffected by the triple tragedy of earthquakes, tsunami, and nuclear power plant instability; and 18 WHEREAS, the late Mike Mansfield, a former Butte miner, University of Montana professor of Latin 19 American and Far East studies, the longest serving U.S. Senate Majority Leader, and for 11 years the U.S. 20 Ambassador to Japan called the U.S.-Japanese relationship "the most important bilateral relationship in the world, 21 bar none"; and 22 WHEREAS, student exchanges between Japanese and Montana high schools and universities, as well as Friendship Force exchanges and overseas trade missions assisted by the State of Montana's trade office in 23 24 Japan, have helped to promote mutual understanding, friendship, tourism, and markets for Montana's agricultural

and other goods; and

WHEREAS, Montana recognizes the efforts of international groups providing humanitarian assistance to the people of Japan, including the United Nations Disaster Assessment and Coordination team that is aiding the international Urban Search and Rescue teams working in Japan and assisting the government of Japan in assessing environmental hazards.
