6	A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF
7	MONTANA RECOMMENDING INTERIM MONITORING ACTIVITIES BY LEGISLATIVE ADMINISTRATIVE AND
8	INTERIM COMMITTEES AS RECOMMENDED BY THE JOINT SUBCOMMITTEES OF THE HOUSE
9	APPROPRIATIONS AND SENATE FINANCE AND CLAIMS STANDING COMMITTEES.

11	WHEREAS, appropriations power is vested in the Legislature by the Montana Constitution; and
12	WHEREAS, the act of appropriating funds is one of the most significant expressions of legislative policy;
13	and
14	WHEREAS, the 2011 Legislature evaluated critical goals for agency operations as part of the
15	appropriations process; and
16	WHEREAS, interim legislative committees are charged with program evaluation and monitoring functions
17	for specific state agencies; and
18	WHEREAS, performance monitoring has the potential to communicate what is received in return for the
19	investment of tax dollars; and
20	WHEREAS, through performance monitoring, both agency personnel and policymakers may gain
21	understanding of program effectiveness instead of focusing on the preservation of existing programs and
22	associated spending levels; and
23	WHEREAS, performance monitoring helps explain the results of previous legislative funding decisions
24	and aids in priority setting; and
25	WHEREAS, performance monitoring helps estimate and justify the potential consequences of new
26	funding decisions;
27	WHEREAS, regular performance monitoring before and during budget deliberations encourages deeper
28	legislative understanding of agency activities and may even garner support for them; and
29	WHEREAS, effective performance monitoring is a partnership between the Executive, Judicial, and
30	Legislative Branches of state government.

1	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
2	STATE OF MONTANA:
3	That the Legislative Finance Committee, in cooperation with the Legislative Council, be requested to
4	recommend to appropriate administrative or interim committees, pursuant to section 5-5-217, MCA, interim
5	monitoring activities as recommended by the Joint Subcommittees on Appropriations.
6	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Joint Subcommittees' recommendation requests interim
7	monitoring of the Department of Public Health and Human Services in regard to the following:
8	(1) implementation of broad-based budget reductions and the effect on operations;
9	(2) implementation of Healthy Montana Kids;
10	(3) evaluation of the impacts of the economy and recession on workload and programs;
11	(4) implementation of components of federal health insurance reform including:
12	(a) integration of Medicaid eligibility determination in the health insurance exchange design;
13	(b) evaluation of the potential for a single system to determine Medicaid eligibility; and
14	(c) outlining components and cost of Medicaid eligibility expansion for consideration by the 2013
15	Legislature;
16	(5) within the Human and Community Services Division:
17	(a) implementation of the broad-based budget and personal services reductions and related effects on
18	the division; and
19	(b) monitoring the caseload growth in SNAP, Medicaid, TANF, LIEAP, and child care and the number
20	of children entering and exiting foster care; and
21	(6) monitoring the impact of the implementation of the components of federal health insurance reform
22	on the Technology Services Division.
23	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Joint Subcommittees' recommendation for interim monitoring of
24	the Department of Fish, Wildlife, and Parks requests followup by the Environmental Quality Council of agency
25	goals and objectives for the:
26	(1) migratory bird program;
27	(2) upland game bird program; and
28	(3) brucellosis in elk study.
29	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Joint Subcommittees' recommendation for interim monitoring of
30	the Department of Environmental Quality requests that the Environmental Quality Council review, on at least an

1 annual basis, the cleanup progress at the KRY site and the progress toward petroleum tank site closures.

- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Joint Subcommittees' recommendation for interim monitoring of
  the Judicial Branch requests that the Legislative Finance Committee monitor the Court Help Program and the
  Water Court.
- 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Joint Subcommittees' recommendation for interim monitoring of 6 the Department of Justice requests that the Legislative Finance Committee monitor the vehicle insurance 7 verification system and the Motor Vehicle Division.
- 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Joint Subcommittees' recommendation for interim monitoring of 9 the Office of the Public Defender and the Department of Corrections requests monitoring of the average daily 10 population of secure assisted living beds.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Joint Subcommittees' recommendation requests interim monitoring of K-12 education and the progress on:
- (1) implementing state actions to create a culture of effective data use and to improve studentperformance; and
- (2) goals and objectives on K-12, higher education, and P-20, including the role and mission of the
   Education and Local Government Interim Committee, which absorbed the Joint Committee on Postsecondary
   Education Policy and Budget that was repealed in 1999.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Joint Subcommittees' recommendation requests interim monitoring of the Preservation Review Board on the status and maintenance needs of agency heritage properties if Senate Bill No. 3 is passed and approved.
- 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Joint Subcommittees also discussed the following for interim 22 monitoring:
- 23 (1) the Department of Public Health and Human Services and the department's activities in regard to:
- 24 (a) House Bills No. 130, No. 131, and No. 132 from the 2009 legislative session;
- 25 (b) children's mental health providers in the Disability Services Division;
- 26 (c) the autism waiver in the Disability Services Division;
- 27 (2) the State Auditor's Office and Insure Montana;
- 28 (3) the Department of Administration:
- (a) the impact of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act on the state employee group plan withrespect to:
