Description of fiscal impact: This bill would exempt certain computer professionals who earn not less than \$27.63 an hour from overtime pay. Savings from the bill are anticipated to be minimal.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

1. Each state agency, as the employer of information technology professionals, would make a determination regarding if the position were considered exempt or non-exempt and therefore earn hour-for-hour compensatory time or overtime based upon the duties of individual positions.
2. There may be some minimal impact to some agencies who convert an employee from non-exempt to exempt status, however the savings is anticipated to be minimal.
3. Overall, there is no fiscal impact anticipated as a result of the bill.
