### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### Assumptions:

#### **Department of Justice**

1. The Gambling Control Division (GCD) received two new gambling operator applications for senior citizen centers in calendar year 2012. The applicant pays the actual costs incurred by the department in determining whether the applicant qualifies for licensure. For nonprofit organizations, the cost of licensure is approximately \$300. Because the applicant pays the actual costs incurred, there would be no fiscal impact related to the passage of HB 264.
2. There are seven senior citizen centers currently holding gambling operator licenses. While operator licenses must be renewed annually, there is currently no fee associated with renewal of an operator license.
