Description of fiscal impact: HB 423 will create some minimal expenses for school districts. There is no fiscal impact to the state.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

1. HB 423 proposes to submit to the qualified electorate a referendum requiring school districts to obtain written consent from a parent or guardian before instructing students in human sexuality education.
2. If the referendum is approved by the voters, schools will incur expenses related to the printing, distributing, and collecting permission forms. The collection of the forms will include staff time spent on following up with parents and guardians.
3. Under HB 423, schools would also be required to make all curriculum materials used in the district's or school's human sexuality instruction available for public inspection prior to the use of the materials in actual instruction. This would involve minimal expense to schools.
