<u>Description of fiscal impact:</u> Electronic voter registrations will reduce cost at the county level associated with processing and accounting for paper voter registrations. The initial cost to the Secretary of State (SOS) will be approximately \$157,000 and future annual maintenance cost would be approximately \$11,000.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

Secretary of State's Office

- 1. Initial costs will include \$100,000 to upgrade the voter registration database and \$46,000 to create the web portal.
- 2. Annual cost will be \$11,000 for the hosting of web portal by Department of Administration SITSD. This cost was inflated by 1.5% in the 2017 biennium.
- 3. The Secretary of State's Office is funded with enterprise funds. Revenues are derived from fees for services, document sales, and other fees established in statute.
