Assumptions:

Department of Public Health and Human Services (DPHHS)

- Existing grants within the Department of Health and Human Services (DPHHS) can accommodate the requirements of this bill.

Office of Public Instruction (OPI)

- The Office of Public Instruction (OPI) would assist the DPHHS in designing the database structures (based on school district organization) for collecting aggregate body mass index data from school districts, provide electronic communications with participating schools, and provide for the secure transmittal of data.

Office of the Secretary of State

- This bill will have minimal cost for postage and administrative duties related to tribal notifications. The Office of the Secretary of State does not receive general fund monies for office operations, but has agreed to assume the fiscal responsibility for this bill.
